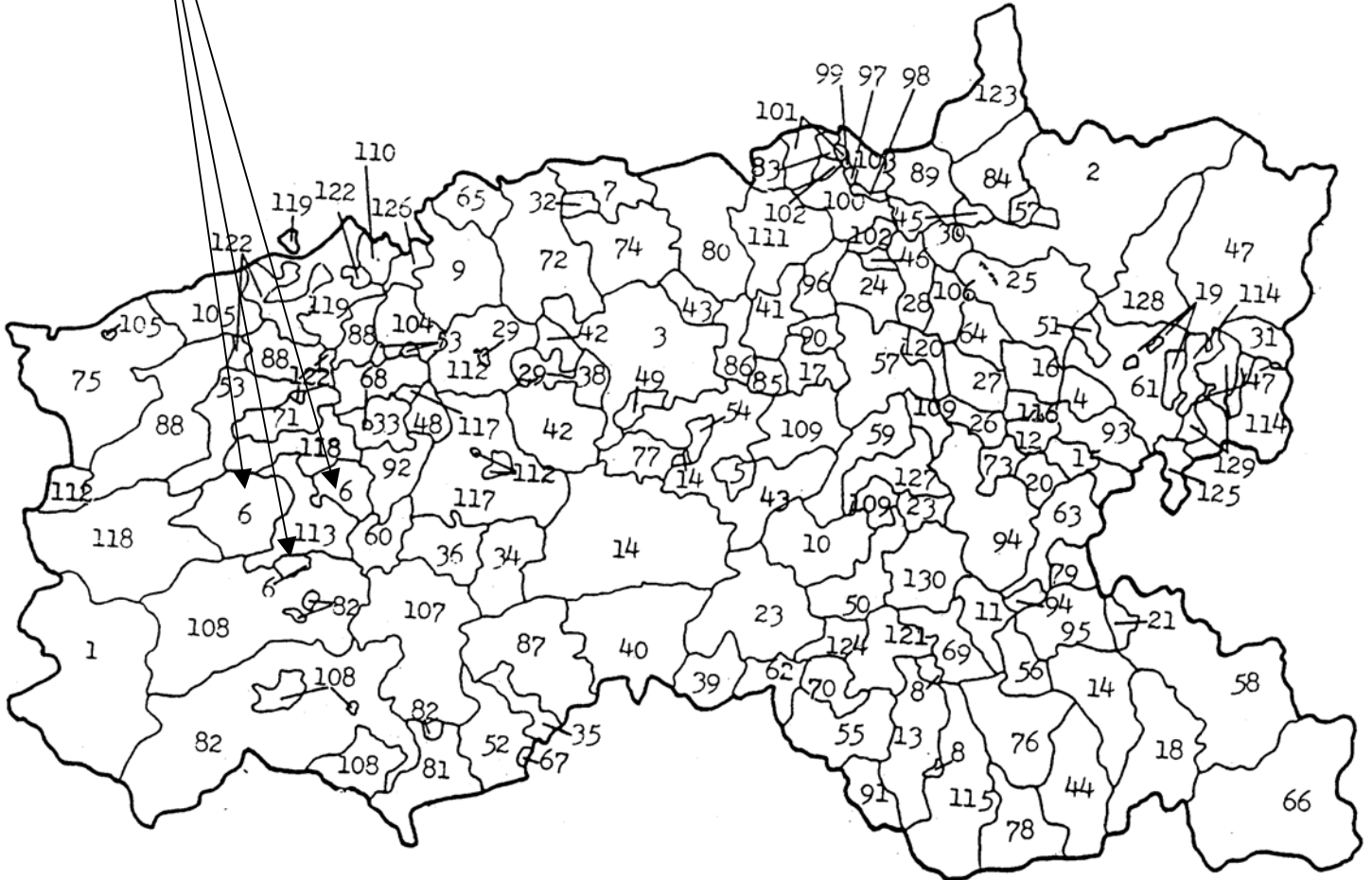

In the Barony of Shanid. Bounded on the N. by Rathronan Ph.; E. by Kilsconnell & Newcastle Phs.; S. by Grange and Monagay Phs.; and W. and N.W. by Rathronan, Dunmoylan, and Newcastle Phs. and by Killaghteen Ph. (Detached) in Monagay Ph.

This is a well cultivated parish. The village of Ardagh is situated in its N.E. extremity; it is just one long street of 65 houses, mostly in very bad repair. Its public buildings are an old church in ruins, a Roman Catholic Chapel, a Police Barrack and a Dispensary. The Fort, which probably gave name to this parish, is situated to the west of the village.

Bounded on the N. by Reerasta Nth Td.; E. by Minister's-Land; S. by Dromrahnee Td.; and W. by the td. of the Commons of Ardagh. Contains 75a. 2r. 3p. st. measure.

This td. is the property of the Representatives of the Revd. Wm. Harkness, and is entirely in tillage and pasture. A road (leading through Ardagh and Athea) from Newcastle to Listowel passes along its S.W. boundary for a considerable distance. There are 3 roads branching out of this td., two in a southerly direction, and one in a northern. Acreable rent - £1 18s.

It is the property of Thos. Goold, Esq., and is entirely in tillage and pasture. A bye-road, which leaves Ardagh Village in a S.W. direction, passes through it. Another road passes along its eastern boundary for a considerable distance; this road leads from Ardagh to Newcastle.

This td. is situated about 2 miles west of Newcastle. It is bounded on the S. W. by Ballyine Td.; on the N.W. by the tds. of Ballinloughane and Knockaboha; and on the N.E. and E. by the parish of Newcastle. It contains 352a. Or. 34p. st. meas.

The property of John Upton, Esq. There are about 30 acres of rough pasture; the remainder of the td. is in tillage and pasture. A road leading from Newcastle through Athea to Listowel enters this td. at its S.E. angle and passes out of it through its western boundary. There is a small village of thatched houses, called Old Mill, in the S.W. extremity of the td. There are 2 ancient forts adjacent. Acreable rent - £0 18s.

It is bounded on the N. by Rathronan Ph.; on the N.E. by Knocknaboha and Ballynabearny Tds.; on the S.E. by Ballyine Td.; on the S. by Rooskagh Td.; and on the S.W. and W. by Rathronan Ph. Contains 1,998a. 2r. 37p. st. meas.

Is the property of Thos. Locke, Esq. Acreable rent - 10s. The greater part is under bog and rough pasture; only small detached portions are in tillage. A road leading from Newcastle through Athea to Listowel enters on the northern, and leaves on the western, boundary of this td. Two branches of the R. Geale rise in this td., one near its S.E. angle, which proceeds N.W., joins the td. boundary, then flows W. by the td. boundary, turning S.W. by the parish and townland boundary until it is joined by another branch of the same river.
