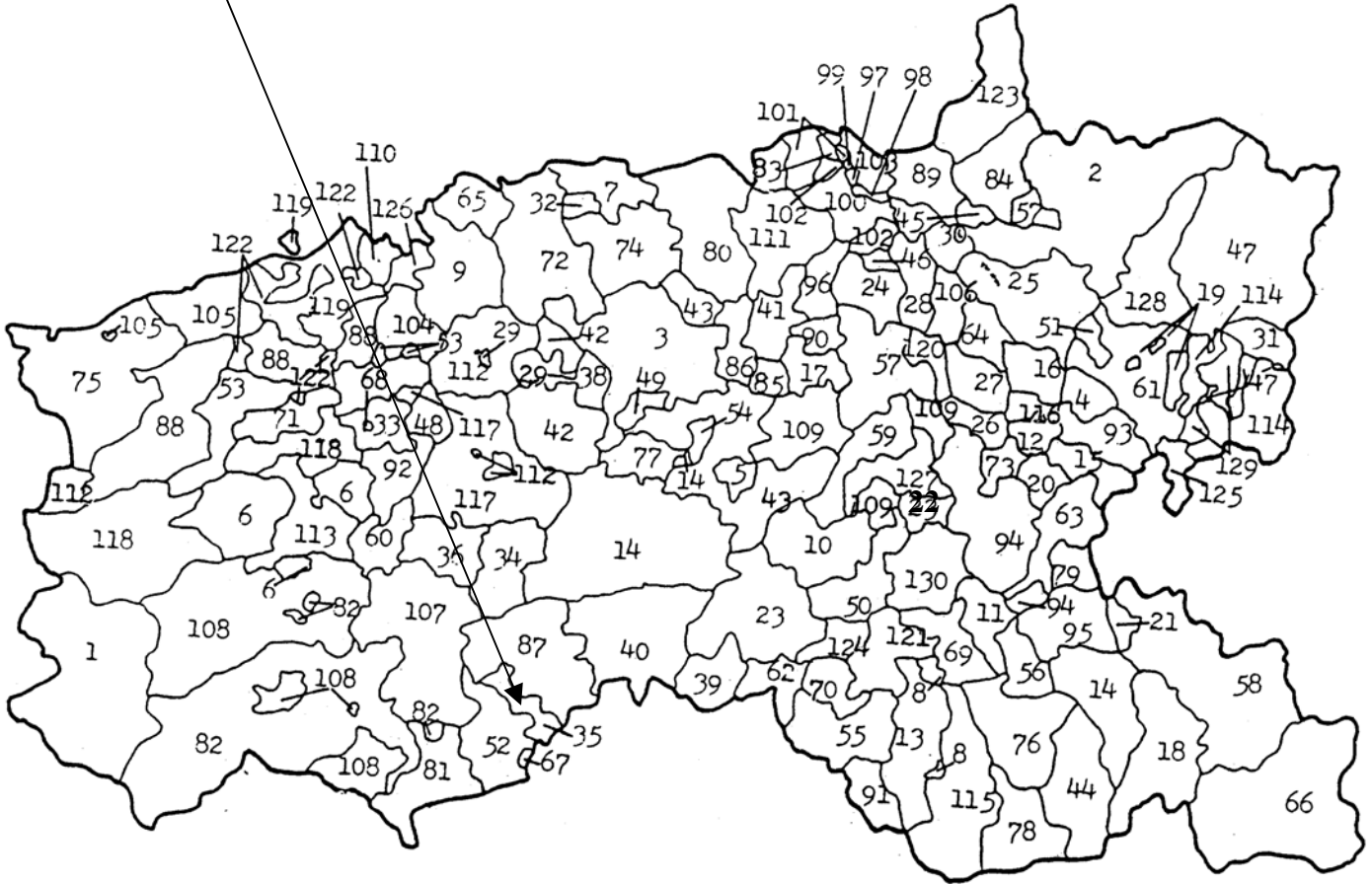

This parish is situated $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles N.E. of Dromcolliher Village and $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles nearly S. of Kilmeedy Village. It is bounded on the N. and E. by Kilmeedy ph.; S. by Kilbolane ph., in the Co. of Cork; and W. by Dromcolliher and Kilmeedy parishes.

It is a small parish, containing only 1,714 acres, st. measure, and is the property of Col. White, Col. Ogan and Robert Jones Stevelly, Esq. It is under tillage and pasture except for some small portions of rough pasture in its northern and southern extremities. The road from Liscarroll to Ballygran forms part of its E. boundary, and the road from Dromcolliher to Kilmeedy passes through it. The R. Deel flows through its S. extremity and forms its S.W. boundary. Cloncrew Church ruins and burial ground are situated in its southern extremity.

This townland is situated in the North end of the parish, and contains 389 acres, statute measure. It is bounded on the East, the North, and the West by the parish of Kilmeedy, and on the South by Dromcolliher parish and the townland of Callahow.

All under tillage and pasture except a portion of rough pasture in the northern extremity of the td. It is the property of Colonel White. The road from Dromcolliher to Kilmeedy Village forms part of its eastern boundary.

This road passes over Finglasha stream by a bridge of the same name as the stream; and E. of the stream is Sherry Fort. The River Deel is the southern boundary of the townland, and Ahaveheen Fort is in its S., and Ahaveheen Well in its S.W., extremity. Acreable rent - £1 5s.

Situated about 2 miles N.E. of Dromcolliher Village, and contains 86 acres, st. measure. It is bounded on the N. by Kilmeedy ph.; E. by Highmount td.; and S. & W. by Coolaknockane td., Dromcolliher ph., and Cloonlara td.

The property of Col. White. All tillage and pasture. The road from Dromcolliher to Kilmeedy and Ballygran villages passes through the western extremity of the td., and over this road the River Deel passes at Anshankill ford. Acreable rent - £1 4s. 9d.

Situated in the N. part of the parish and contains 180 acres. It is bounded on the N. and E. by Kilmeedy ph.; S. by Ballymongaun td.; and W. by Dromcolliher ph. and Sheshiv td.

Is the property of Col. White. All under tillage and pasture except a small portion of rough pasture in its northern extremity. The R. Deel forms its W. boundary, over which there is a ford called Ahcullahow; and the road from Dromcolliher to Kilmeedy and Ballygran villages passes through the townland. There is an ancient fort to the west of the road to Kilmeedy Village. In the td. are 2 Trigl. Stations, called Cloonlara and Cloonlara S. Acreable rent - £1 7s.

Situated about 2 miles N.E. of Dromcolliher Village. Is bounded on the North, West, and South by Ballymongaun td., Dromcolliher ph., and the parish of Kilbolane, in the Co. of Cork. Contains 155 acres.

This townland is the property of Robert Jonas Stevelly, Esq. It is entirely tillage and pasture. There are 2 ancient forts near its N.W. boundary, and the River Deel forms its eastern boundary, over which river there is a ford (at a lane), called Ahclooncrew.

This townland is situated about 2½ miles S.W. of Kilmeedy Parish. It is bounded on the N. by Ahaveheen td.; E. by Kilmeedy ph. and Cloonlara td.; S. by Sheshiv td. and Dromcolliher parish. Contains 260 acres.

Is the property of Colonel White, and is entirely under tillage and pasture. The road from Dromcolliher to Kilmeedy Village passes N. through its centre. The River Deel forms its N. and W. boundary, on which stands Accrour Bridge. Callahow Fort is in the eastern extremity of the td. Acreable rent - £1 5s.

This townland is situated about 2¼ miles N.E. of Dromcolliher Village. It is bounded on the N. by Highmount td.; E. by Highmount td. and Kilmeedy ph.; S. by the ph. of Kilbolane, Co. Cork; and W. by Coolaknockane td.

Is the property of R. J. Stevelly, Esq., and contains 166 acres. The entire td. is under tillage and pasture, & the road from Lis Carroll to Ballygran Village passes through its eastern extremity. In its western extremity is Cloncrew

This td. is situated about 2½ miles N.E. of Dromcolligher Village. It is bounded on the N. and E. by Kilmeedy ph.; S. by Cloncrew td.; and W. by the tds. of Coola-knockane and Ballymongaun. Contains 284 acres.

Is the property of Colonel Ogan, and is under tillage and pasture except a very small portion of rough pasture on its southern boundary. The road from Liscarroll to Ballygran forms its eastern boundary, to the west of which is a small lough, called Loughsiveen. The River Deel is on its western boundary. Acreable rent - £1 19s.

At the junction of Callahow, Sheshiv and Cloonlara tds. in this river is Ahcallowhow Ford. Clashvaun Fort is in the northern, and Sheshiv Fort in the south-eastern, extremity of this td. Acreable rent - £1 4s.
