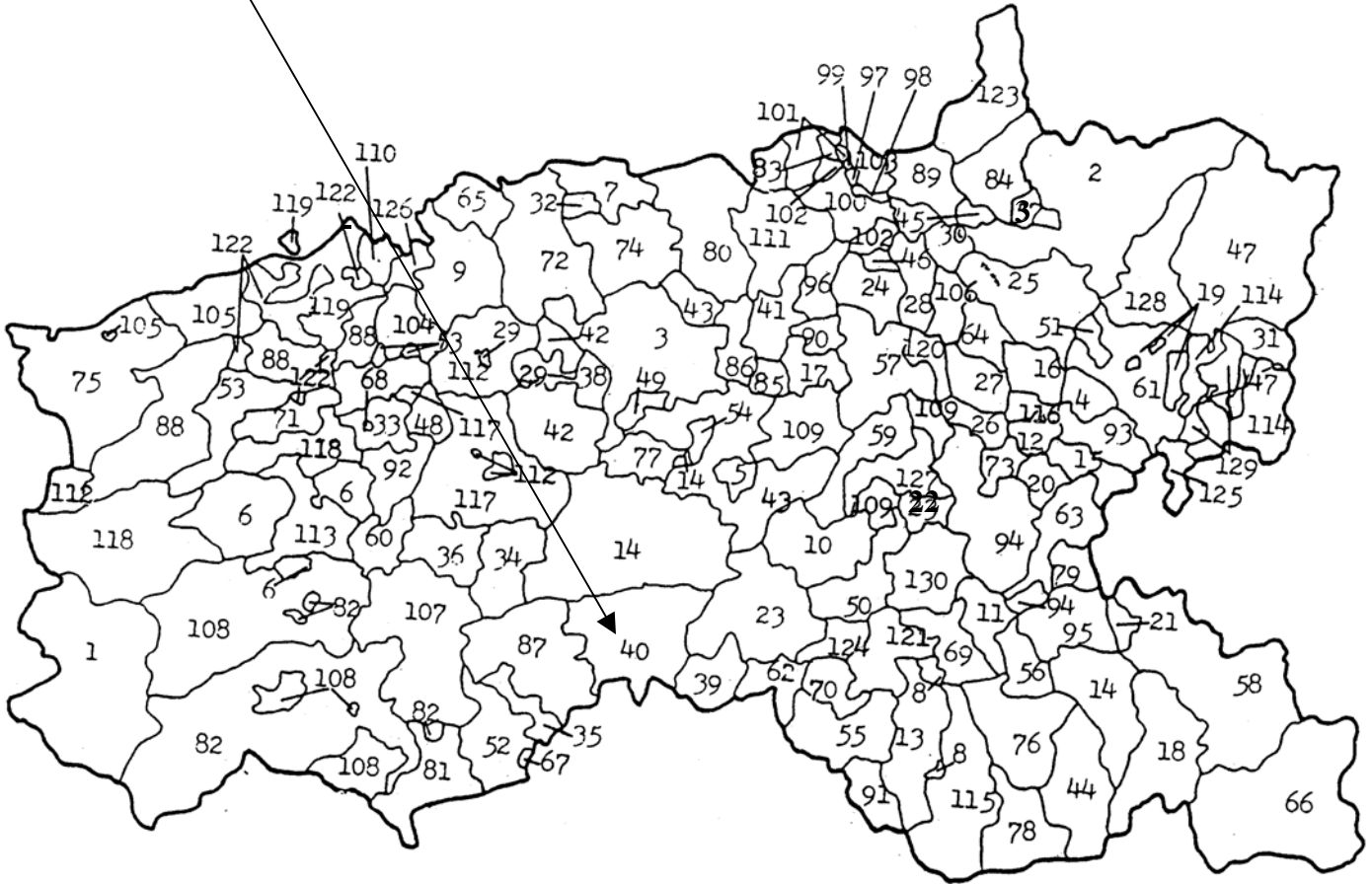

(N.B. It got the name Castletown because the Mac Enirys, the ruling-family of the district, had their castle here until its destruction during the Cromwellian period.)

This parish is bounded on the N. by Ballingarry ph.; W. by Kilmeedy ph.; S. by Kilbolane ph. and by the ph. of Castletown in the barony of Orrery and Kilmore, Co. Cork; and E. by the phs. of Coleman's Well and Bruree.

Its surface is hilly and lies comparatively high, yet consists of fertile land with a mixture of valuable bog. The road from Newcastle to Mallow traverses its interior. Its Church is very old and in a state of dilapidation, the Protestant population of the parish being very small, numerically.

This townland is situated in the south extremity of the parish. It is bounded on the N. by the td. of Drewscourt East; W. and S. by Kilbolane ph.; and E. by the ph. of Castletown, in the bary. of Orrery and Kilmore.

It contains 406 acres, all arable, and is the property of John Green, Esq. of Greenmount. In it are Ballybane Trigl. Station and Ballybane Bridge. The bridge has 3 arches, and is situated on the N. boundary, between the tds. of Drewscourt E. and Ballybane.

This townland is situated in the centre of the parish. It is bounded on the N. by Ballygarry ph.; W. by the tds. of Caherclogh, Rossmore, Croghteen and Coolagowan; S. by the tds. of Cloonee, Ballyagran and Rossbane; and E. by the tds. of Ballysalla, Dreenaan and Graig.

It is the property of Chas. Conyers, Castletown, and contains 1,473 acres. In the E. of the td. are Castletown Conyers House, Lismemmen Fort, and Castletown Church (in ruins) and Burial-ground. In the S. are Cooreagh Fort, Delvras Holy Well, and Gobnet's Fort. In the W. are Knockroe Fort, Knockroe Cottage, Knockroe Lake and Addeen Fort; and in the N. are also three forts.

This td. is the property of James D. Lyons, Esq., Croom, and contains 529 acres, arable with the exception of about 25 acres of rough ground. There are 3 forts in the townland, one in the N.W. part, one in the S.W. part, and the third in the S. of the td.

This td. is the property of Richard Mason, Esq., Cappanighane, and it contains 772 acres, all arable. In the N.E. of the td. are Moll Hanneen's Fort and Crossbar (Crossmaria) Bridge. In the N. are Morrissy's Fort, Glenbrook Fort and Glenbrook House. In the W. are Cappanighane House, Fort and Children's Burial-ground. In the centre of the td. are also 3 forts.

It is the property of William Monsell, Esq., and contains 279 acres, of which about $\frac{1}{2}$ is bog and the remainder arable land.

This townland is situated in the W. end of the parish. It is bounded on the N. by the tds. of Croghteen and Castletown; E. by the tds. of Castletown and Cloonee; S. by the td. of Drewscourt W.; and W. by the tds. of Croghteen and Drewscourt W.

It is the property of Henry Adams, Esq., Tipperary, & contains 323 acres, all arable land. In it are 3 ancient forts, one, called Coolagowan Fort, near the E. boundary, another near the N.E. boundary, and the third near the W. boundary, of the townland.

It is the property of Captain Hilton, Rossmore, and contains 258 acres, of which about $\frac{1}{2}$ is arable, about $\frac{1}{4}$ is bog, and the remainder is demesne. There is an ancient fort about the centre of the townland.

It is the property of Henry Croker, Esq., Drumkeen. There is a fort in the N., and another in the S.E., of this townland. In the W. part is Derraulin House.

It is the property of Mrs. O'Kelly, Kinsale, and contains 992 acres, including about 170 acres of demesne, about 15 acres of rough pasture, and the remainder arable land. In the S. of the td. is Drews Court House, and about the central part are a Trigl. Station, called Drews Court, and Drews Court Cottage.
