Derrigalvane Parish

Situated about 2 miles S.E. of the City of Limerick and in the Literties. In two parts - one is bounded E. by the phs. of Carrigparson and Kilmurry; N. by Kilmurry Ph.; W. by St. Nicholas and Donaghmore Phs.; and S. by Cahernarry; the other is bounded E. & S. by Abbington Ph.; N. by Killeenagariff, and W. by Kilmurry Phs:

Derrygalvin Ph. (contd.)

The first of these portions is about 2 miles long and 1 m. broad, with a road leading from Limerick to Tipperary through it. The other portion, which is about 4 miles from Limerick, is about $\frac{5}{4}$ mile long and $\frac{1}{2}$ mile broad, with a road through its centre leading from Limerick to Abbington. Both portions are level and chiefly cultivated lands, and contain 9 townlands.

Situated in the W. end of the ph. and bounded on the E. by Kilmurry Ph.; on the W. by St. Nicholas Ph.; on the N. by Garryglass Id.; and on the S. by Knockananty Id.

Contains 147 acres which are arable. Soil partly deep, producing potatoes, corn, wheat and flax. The proprietor Michael T. Staunton, Esq. has it let per his agent Mr. David Fitzgerald to 7 tenants by leases of 2 lives at £4 per acre. Co. Cess generally 4/6 to 6s. per acre half yearly. Tithe 2/4 per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Dixon Esq. has it let per his agent Mr. Henry Hall to 6 tenants with leases of 1 life in farms of 12 to 2 acres at £3 3s. per acre. Neither Co. Cess nor tithe paid by this townland. Bog used for fuel is very scarce. Prevailing Names -McMahon.

The proprietor Pierce Mahony Esq. has it let to Mr. Jeremiah Shine (who has it in his own possession) by a lease of 1 life at £2 15s. per acre. Co. Cess generally 4/6 to 6s. per acre half yearly. Tithe 2/6 per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Contains 219 acres which are arable. Soil partly deep, with limestone, producing potatoes, corn, wheat & flax. The proprietors Captn. J. Redmond, Thos. Evans Esq. and others have it let per their agent Thos. Leahy Esq. to 2 tenants by leases expiring in 1846 at £1 12s. per acre, and they again for same term to 7 others at £5 5s. per acre. Co. Cess 4/6 to 6s. per acre, $\frac{1}{2}$ yearly. Tithe 2/4 per do. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Is a graveyard in the centre of which is a small ruin, the remains of a house of worship. It is placed on a small eminence, covered with hawthorns, &c., and enclosed by a wall.

Situated in the centre of Coolehenane Td.

This house was built in 1824 at the expense of about £800. It is 3 story high, and is the seat of Mr. Jeremiah Shine.

Situated in the N.W. end of Scart Id., and N. of the road from Limerick to Abbington.

This mill was built in 1792. It is a thatched house, about 40 by 20 feet, and is used as a Corn Mill.

Thobar Ammeen

557 Thobar Ammeen -- Inhabitants 14 Tobar Aimin, Aimin's Well. Aimin seems a diminutive of Amos. Amy is the diminutive form in Co. Kilkenny. O'D. -- J. O'D. Toberameen Situated in the W. end of Scart Td. It is about 6 chains E. of Scart Mill, and 21 chains N. of the road from Limerick to Abbington. This well is about 2 feet in diameter, of spring water, and placed in a cultivated field. It is not dedicated to any sacred use. -- Inhabitants 15 Twopothouse Cross Tigheán Dá Phota, the little house of the two pots. Twopothouse Cross -- J. O'D. Situated in Killonan Td. and at the centre of the N.W. boundary. Is the crossing of two roads, the one from Limerick to Abbington, and the other from the Limerick & Tipperary Road in a N.E. direction to the River Mulkear. Ballysimon Staunton -- B. S. 16 See Td. J.
