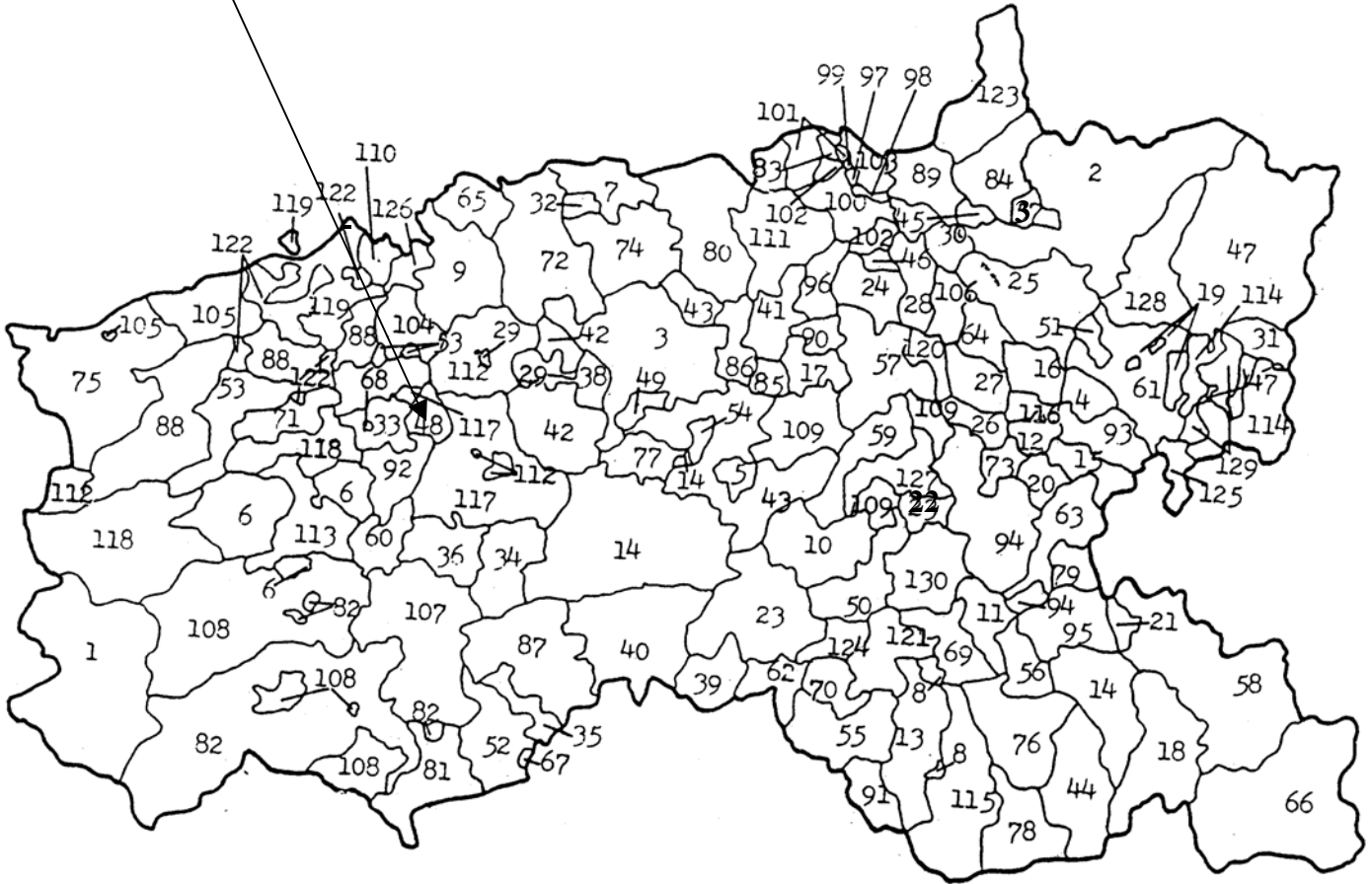

Ardnaveeagh (contd.)

This Td. is bounded on the N.E. by a road leading from Rathkeale to Askeaton, which is the boundary of the td. of Cloghanarold; on the E. and S. by Rathkeale Ph.; on the S.W. by Kilsconnell Ph.; and on the N.W. by Riddlestown.

Is the property of James Fitzgerald Massy, Esq., and is entirely under tillage and pasture. On the N.E. boundary is a road leading from Rathkeale to Askeaton. On the S.W. boundary is a bye road, and on the S. is a road leading from Rathkeale to Newcastle. There is a bridge at its northern extremity. Acreable rent - £2 6s.

The property of J. F. Massy, Esqr. All under tillage and pasture. Bounded on the E. by the River Deel, and on the W. by a road leading from Rathkeale to Askeaton. Also, a road from Rathkeale to Glin passes through this townland. Acreable rent - £2 10s.

Bounded on the N. by Kilbradran Ph., E. by the tds. of Kilcool and Cloghanarold, S.E. by Ardnaveagh Td., S. by Kilscannell Ph., W. by Clonagh Ph., and N.W. by a detached portion of the Ph. of Rathkeale.

The property of George Blennerhasset, Esq. A portion of the western boundary and a portion near the junction of the boundary of Ardnaveagh and Cloghanarold are subject to floods; the rest of the td. is under tillage and pasture. A road leading from Rathkeale to Asheaton passes by its eastern boundary, and a road leading from Rathkeale to Glin passes through the townland. Acreable rent - £1 10s.

A large house, 2 stories high, with offices, a plantation, and the ruins of an old small castle. The residence of James Fitzgerald Massy, Esqr.

A large island on the River Deel. There are two forts on this island, one near the centre and the other near the northern extremity of the island. Parts of this island are subject to floods.

Lisheenadearea -- Local 9

Lisín is the only name known to the inhabitants. It means "a small earthen fort".

A fort, surrounded by a hawthorn hedge and with trees planted on it. It is near the south-western angle of the td., and about 2 chains east of the road leading from Rathkeale to Askeaton.

Kilcool Wood -- Local 10

In the townland of Kilcool.

A wood so called about 17 chains long, and near the S.E. side of the townland.

Kilcool Bridge -- Local 11

On the boundary between Kilcool and Curragnadeely in the parish of Nantinan.

A large bridge of 6 arches across the River Deel, on the road leading from Rathkeale to Glin.

Kisshaghtreadaun -- Local 12

Ciseach a' Trodain

Ciseach means a causeway of basketwork. Trod is obviously the true name of the stream.

Kissaghatrodaun -- J. O'D.

On the boundary between Ranahan and Riddlestown. A stream flowing into the Deel at Ardlamon, in the Ph. of Kilbradran.

In the townland of Riddlestown.

A large 3 story house, with offices, a plantation, and a garden. The residence of Gerald Blennerhasset, Esq.
