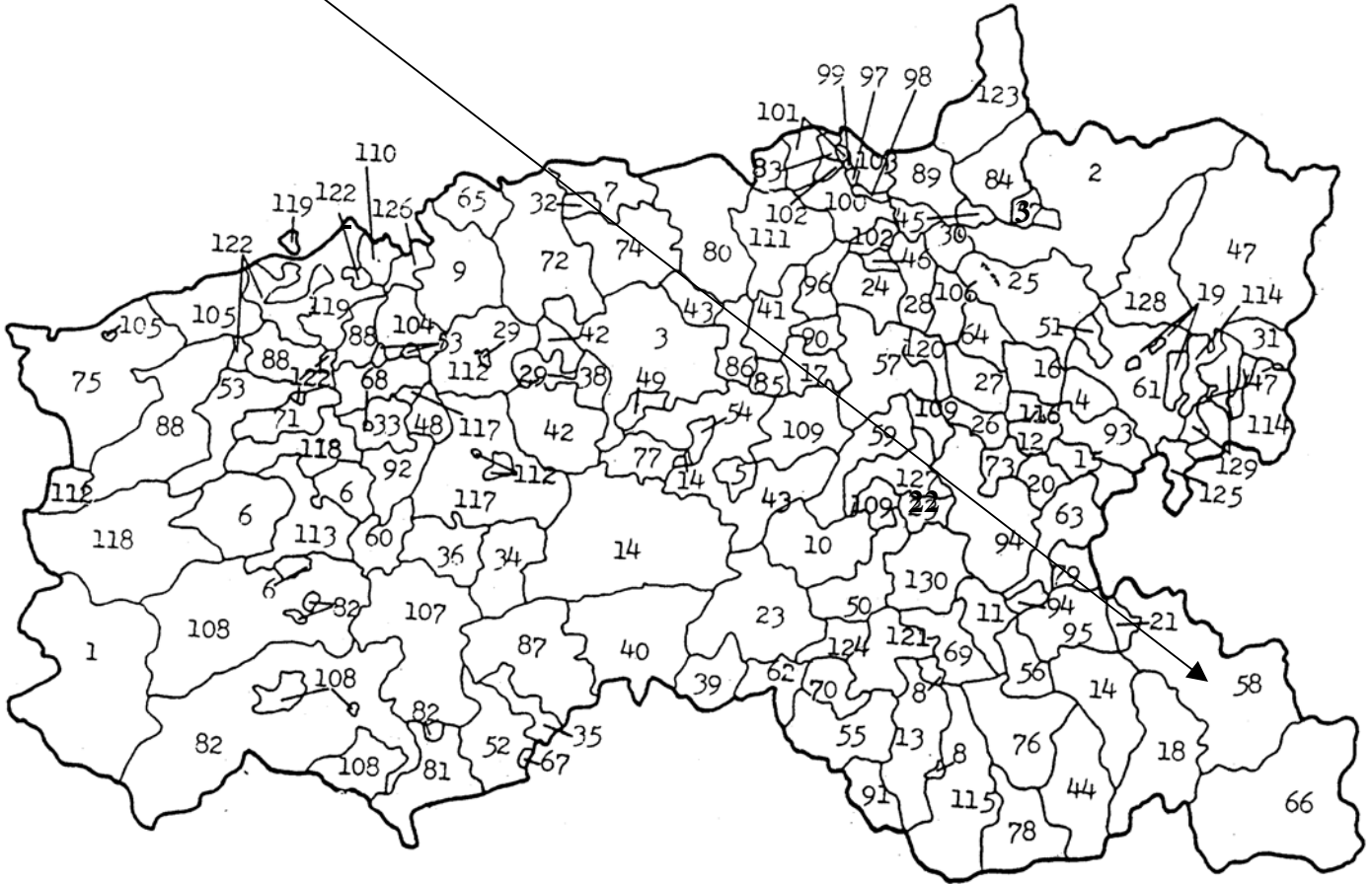

Bounded on the N. by the Ph. of Emly; W. by the Phs. of Ballyscaddan, Knocklong, Glenbroghaun and Ballylanders; E, by the Ph. of Clonbeg in the Co. of Tipperary; and on the S. by the Ph. of Kilbeheny.

This parish contains 15,457 acres, statute measure. Principally arable and pasture land, intermixed with some portions of bog and mountain. The parish abounds with roads, streams and rivers. There are several forts and quarries interspersed. The village of Galbally is situated in the townlands of Galbally and Park, which are divided from Tipperary by the Aherlow River.

Is the property of Lord Guillamore, Rockbarton, and contains 519 acres. All arable and pasture land. The western boundary is the stream which runs along the road leading from Galbally to Tipperary. There are 3 forts and a few houses interspersed.

It is the property of Lord Guillamore, Rockbarton, and contains 305 acres. All arable and pasture land. The River Aherlow forms the N. boundary. There is 1 fort towards the N., and the road from Ballylanders passes through the western part. The River Aherlow also forms the western boundary.

In the east of the parish. Is bounded on the N. by the River Aherlow, which separates it from Tipperary; S. by the tds. of Kilsacanlan and Knockaunbrack; W. by Park Td.; and E. by the td. of Lissanard.

Is the property of the Hon. George Massy of Limerick, and contains 597 acres. All arable land. There is a road from W. to E. through it, on the north side of which is Galtee Lodge, and on the other side, more to the East, is Janeville House, both houses being surrounded by ornamental ground. The above mentioned road leads through the County of Tipperary.

Anglesborough (contd.)

It is the property of Lord Massy, Hermitage, and contains 709 acres. This is the most southern townland in Galbally. One-third of it, on the East, is mountain; one-third, towards the West, is arable; and the central part is ornamented. In the centre of this last part stands Anglesborough House. Two roads pass through the west part, one from Ballylanders to Mitchelstown, the other from Mitchelstown to Tipperary, which borders the plantation

In the North of the parish. It is bounded on the N. by Moanmore td.; W. by Ballylooby td.; E. by Ballinwear Td.; and S. by Lissard Td.

Is the property of John Howley, Dublin, and contains 317 acres. The western boundary is centre of road leading to Emly, and the road to Tipperary crosses the townland nearly in the centre. There is a small portion of bog in the South, through which a stream runs that divided it from Lissard.

Is the property of Lord Massy, Hermitage, and contains 251 acres, all arable land. There are two forts in this td.; one is nearly central and is called Lissnagreeve. In the western part of the townland there is an orchard. There are several neat houses interspersed. The road from Mitchelstown to Emly forms the western boundary, and that from Mitchelstown to Galbally the eastern boundary, of the townland.

Is the property of Lord Kingston, Mitchelstown, and contains 156 acres, of which the central portion only is arable land. The eastern boundary is the River Aherlow. A few mud houses are on the south side, and towards the centre, of the townland.

Is the property of Peter Lowe, Esq. Contains 397 acres. This townland is in general a mixture of rough pasture & arable land. Nearly central of the td. there is a road bearing N. and S. To the west of the road there is an ancient fort. In the western part of the td. there is a well called Paradise Idol. There are several houses interspersed throughout the td. The road from Mitchelstown to Tipperary passes through the td.

Is the property of the Hon. G. E. Massy, Limerick, and contains 643 acres, nearly half of which is mountain towards the South; the remainder is arable land. It is separated from the Co. Tipperary by the River Aherlow, which forms the eastern boundary. The N. boundary is the centre of a road. Another road runs through the townland from N. to S. There are a few houses interspersed through the townland.

Is the property of Lord Massy, Stagdale, and contains 619 acres, nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ of which on the east side is mountain; the remainder is arable land. The road from Mitchelstown to Galbally and to Tipperary passes through the centre. The td. is divided from Boolalisheen on the East by a mountain stream. There are several forts and houses interspersed.

Is the property of G. L. Bennett, Esq., Gleneefy. It contains 250 acres, about $\frac{1}{3}$ of which is arable, with a portion of mountain pasture in the West, and the remainder ornamental ground. Gleneefy House is in the N. of the td., and the road from Galbally to Ballylanders forms the S. boundary. The road from Galbally to Tipperary runs by the eastern boundary.

Is the property of Lord Massy, Stagdale. Contains 396 acres. The road from Galbally to Ballylanders divides it on the E. from Deer Park, and the road from Ballylanders to Tipperary forms its western boundary. There is another road which passes through it, leading to the town of Galbally.

Is the property of Lord Massy, Hermitage, and contains 764 acres, all arable land except for what bog lies in the West. The road from Limerick to Galbally, Tipperary and Ballylanders passes through the td. It is divided from Newtown by another road from Ballylanders to Tipperary. There is a church in the centre, and a fort called Doon, to the south of which is St. Patrick's Well.

The town of Galbally is situated in the South, and extends east as far on the road to Caher as the bridge which makes the county boundary, and west as far as Low Town. North of the town there is a gravel pit. In the town are a National School, a Church and a Chapel, with every other sort of requisites for the inhabitants.
