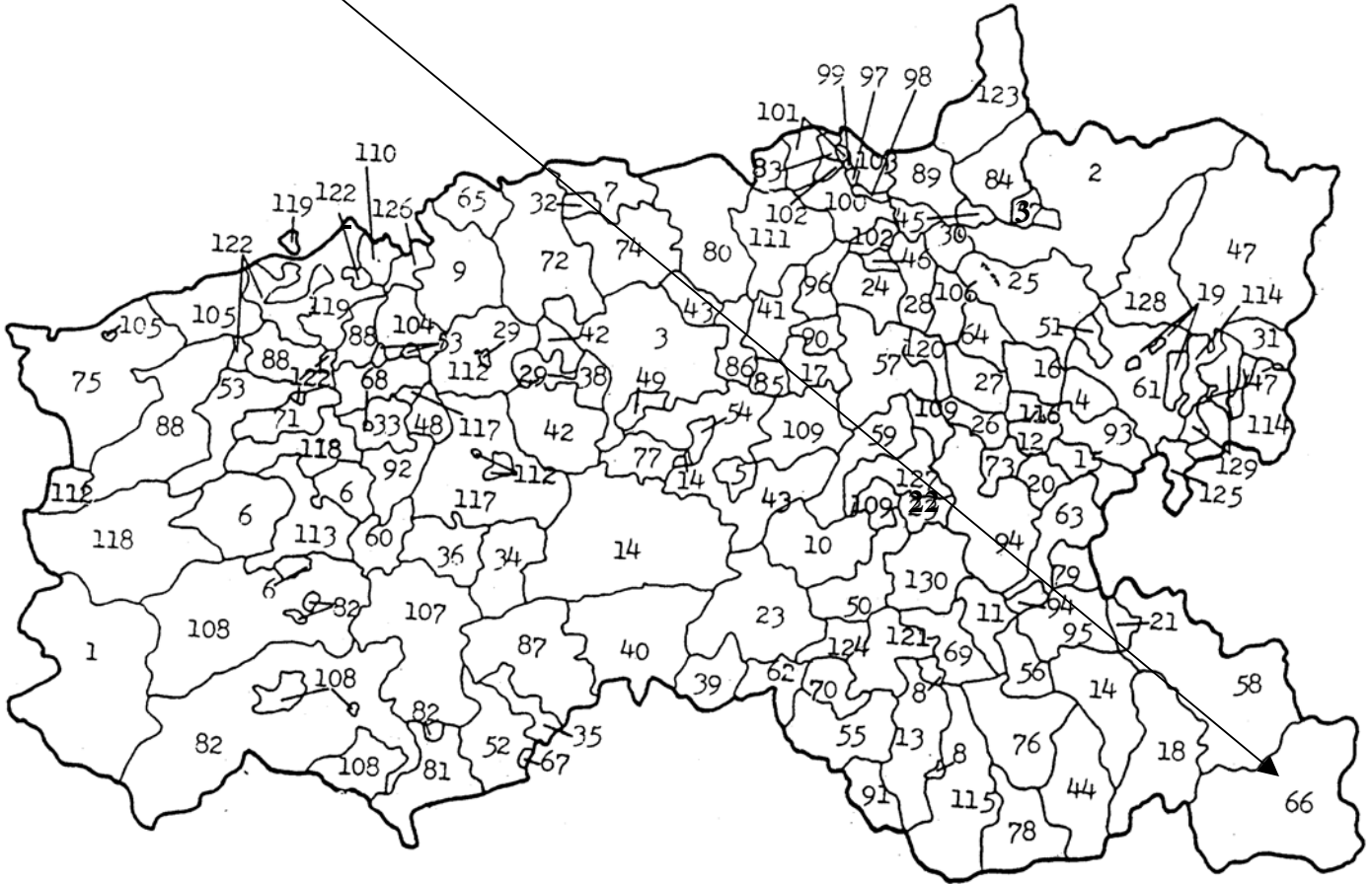

Bounded on the N. by the Ph. of Clonbeg, Co. Tipperary; E. by Ballyporeen Ph. in same county; S. by Mitchelstown Ph., Co Cork; and on the W. by the Phs. of Galbally and Ballylanders (Co. Limerick) and Marshalstown Ph. (Co. Cork).

This parish forms a small projecting wing of the County of Limerick between Co. Tipperary and Co. Cork. It occupies the extreme south-east portion of the Barony of Coshlea, and contains 15,369 acres, statute measure. The Funcheon River so circles round the parish as to trace the main part of the boundary with both Tipperary and Cork counties. The parish in general may be said to consist of arable land, interspersed with mountain and portions of rough pasture. There is very little bog. A well planted glen extends among the hills to the Galtee Mountains, on the highest of which, called Galtee More, is a lake. There are several roads through the parish, & the remains of the ancient church still stand on the N. bank of the R. Funcheon.

This townland is situated in the N.W. of the parish. It is bounded on the N. by the Tds. of Inchacomb and Anglesborough in Galbally Ph.; W. by Lackendarragh Td.; S. by Geeragh and Carrow Tds.; and E. by the Td. of Knocknascrow.

It is the property of Lord Massy, and contains 1,253 acres. Nearly $\frac{2}{3}$ is mountain, extending from N. to S. The remainder is arable and pasture land, interspersed on the West with wood. The whole western boundary is the centre of a road leading to Tipperary on the N., and to Kilbeheny on the S. Carnbaun Trigl. Station is in the centre of the td., and Pigeon Rock Trigl. Station is on the E. boundary, half of which boundary is lockspitted, the rest being the centre of a stream. In the S. of the td. is a quarry; in the N. Anglesborough Chapel.

This townland is in the E. of the parish. It is bounded on the N. by Knocknascrow Td.; W. by Scrowmore Td.; S. by the tds. of Knockrour and Behanagh; and E. by Coolattin Td.

It is the property of Lord Kingston, Mitchelstown, Co. Cork, and contains 208 acres. There is a road running from N. to S. through this townland.

This townland is situated in the S.E. of the parish. It is bounded on the N. by the Tds. of Coolattin and Boher; W. by the Tds. of Knockrour and Boher; S. by the Tds. of Castle Quarter and Church Quarter; and E. by Loughananna and Ballynatona Tds.

It is the property of Lord Kingston, and contains 320 acres. The River Behanagh bounds this townland on the West. It is all arable land. Knockrour Mill is situated on the southern boundary, near Mill Bridge. There is a fort in the southern part of the townland.

In the S.E. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by Behanagh Td.; W. by the td. of Church Quarter; S. by the Co. Cork; and E. by Knockcommaun and Loughananna Tds.

It is the property of Lord Kingston, and contains 308 acres. It is all arable, with the exception of a small portion in the South which is liable to flooding, and on the S. of that there is a small portion of bog. The eastern boundary is the centre of a road which leads to Mitchelstown. Another road runs from E. to W., on the north side of which is Sweep's Fort. There are two quarries and several lime kilns in this townland.

In the E. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by Carrigeen Td.; W. by Loughananna Td.; S. by Knockcommaun Td.; and E. by Skeheenaranky Td., in Co. Tipperary.

Is the property of the Earl of Kingston, and contains 351 acres, all arable and pasture. The River Attychraun forms the eastern boundary as far as Brackvaun Bridge. The road on the South leading to Ballyporeen (Co. Tipperary) forms the southern boundary. There is a stream running from

N. to S., which divides Brackvaun from Loughananna and Knockcommoun Tds. The road leading to Mitchelstown runs across this townland.

In the W. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the Tds. of Lackendarragh and Lisnalanniv; W. by Ballyarthur Td., in the Co. Cork; S. by Kilglass Td.; and E. by Glenacurraun Td.

Is the property of Lord Mitchelstown, and contains 518 acres. The townland is mountain towards the N. and W., bordering the Co. Cork; the remainder is made up of arable, pasture and wood. There are 2 roads running through the td., one leading to Mitchelstown, the other more East leading to Ballylanders, adjacent to which on the N. is a Police Barrack. There are several houses scattered throughout the townland.

In the S. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the Tds. of Knocknascrow and Anglesborough; W. by Geeragh Td.; S. by the Tds. of Garrane and Ahalush (sic), in the Co. Cork; and E. by the Tds. of Garrycurragha and Coolboy.

Is the property of the Earl of Kingston, and contains 502 acres. It is arable, with the exception of the mountainous part in the N. It is bounded on the W. by a stream which, running S. through Geeragh Bridge, joins the Funcheon River. The road leading to Kilbeheny passes through this td. There is a quarry in the S. of the td.

In the N. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by Longford Td. (Co. Tipperary) and by the Tds. of Ballyeena, Bainteen and Barna in Galbally Ph.; W. by Knocknascrow Td. and Galbally Ph.; S. by Carrigeen Td.; and E. by the Td. of Knocknagalty.

Is the property of Lord Kingston, and contains 2,082 acres, $\frac{2}{3}$ of which is mountain; the remainder, the southern part, is arable and pasture. Carrigeen stream runs S. through the td., and Coolatiny stream divides the td. on the S. from Knocknascrow Td. There is a portion of bog in the East of the td., on the E. of which bog is a wood. The eastern boundary is the centre of a stream.

In the S. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by Knocknagalty and Carrigeen Mountain Tds.; W. by the Tds. of Knocknascrow and Coolattin; S. by Behanagh and Loughanna Tds.; and E. by Brackvaun Td. and By Skeheenaranky Td. in the Co. Tipperary.

Is the property of Lord Kingston and contains 603 acres, of which the greater part is arable and pasture, and about $\frac{1}{3}$ on the East is wood. The R. Attychraun divides it on the E. from Co. Tipperary, and the R. Behanagh forms the western boundary. There are several roads through the td. There are also several houses and a School House.

Is the property of Lord Kingston, and contains 199 acres, arable and pasture except the wood on the E., which skirts the R. Behanagh, the eastern boundary. The

In the S. of the parish. Bounded on the N. by the Tds. of Knockrour and Coolboy; W. by Garryourragha Td.; S. by the Co. Cork, and E. by the Tds. of Church Quarter and Behanagh.

Is the property of Lord Kingston, and contains 255 acres, all arable land. It is divided from the Co. Cork by the R. Funcheon, which forms the southern boundary. The road leading to Kilbeheny is the northern boundary from Castle Bridge to Mill Bridge. Kilbeheny Castle stands N.W. of Castle Bridge. There is a burial ground here. Several houses are interspersed.

The Village of Kilbeheny is situated about the centre of a Cross-roads, the road on the S. leading to Mitchelstown, and the other W. to Mill Bridge. Adjacent to the Village is a graveyard, in which stand the ruins of Kilbeheny Church. On the R. Funcheon, which forms the southern boundary, is Kilbeheny Bridge.

Is the property of Lord Kingstone, and contains 649 acres, the greater part of which is mountain pasture, and the remainder arable and pasture. Coolboy Mountain is on the West. Glencastle stream runs from the N. and joins the southern boundary. There are several houses, lime kilns and ruins interspersed.

The property of Lord Kingston, containing 273 acres, mostly arable land, interspersed with portions of rough pasture. In the southern part there is a road bearing E. and W. across the td. There are a number of streams in the td.; one principal one runs S. across the td. nearly central. There are several neat houses interspersed.

The property of Lord Kingston, containing 424 acres, all arable land. In the S. part of the td. there is a large wood. Bounded on the N. by a road running E. and W. In the E. of the td. there is a road bearing N. and S., and forming a cross road with the above described road, near the East boundary. There are several neat houses interspersed.

Adjacent to the west boundary, which is the centre of a stream, there is a large wood, extending from N. to S. N. of townland there is a road bearing E. and W. The centre of a road forms the E. and S. boundaries. There are several houses interspersed.

It is the property of Lord Kingston, and contains 1,747 acres. The greater part is mountain, intermixed with arable and pasture. Dawson's Table, an antiquity, is on the N. boundary. The E. boundary is the centre of a stream, bordering a plantation.

Is the property of Lord Kingston, and contains 671 acres, all arable land. Adjacent to the E. boundary there is a large wood, and several small portions of woodland are interspersed through the td. Near the northern end there is an ancient fort. There are several roads bearing in all directions through the td. Near the northern boundary is a mill, and several houses are interspersed.

Is the property of Lord Kingston, and contains 157 acres, all mountain except about $\frac{1}{3}$, which is reclaimed. There is a small portion of bog in or about the centre. Cooltiny Stream forms the E. boundary. Temple Hill Trigl. Station is on the N. boundary, bordering Galbally Ph. In the S. are a few houses. There are several limekilns in the td.

There is a fort in the W. with the same name as the td. A ditch on this west side divides the td. from the Co. Cork. The N. boundary is the centre of a stream. The E. boundary is the centre of a road. The road leading to Ballylanders passes through this td.
