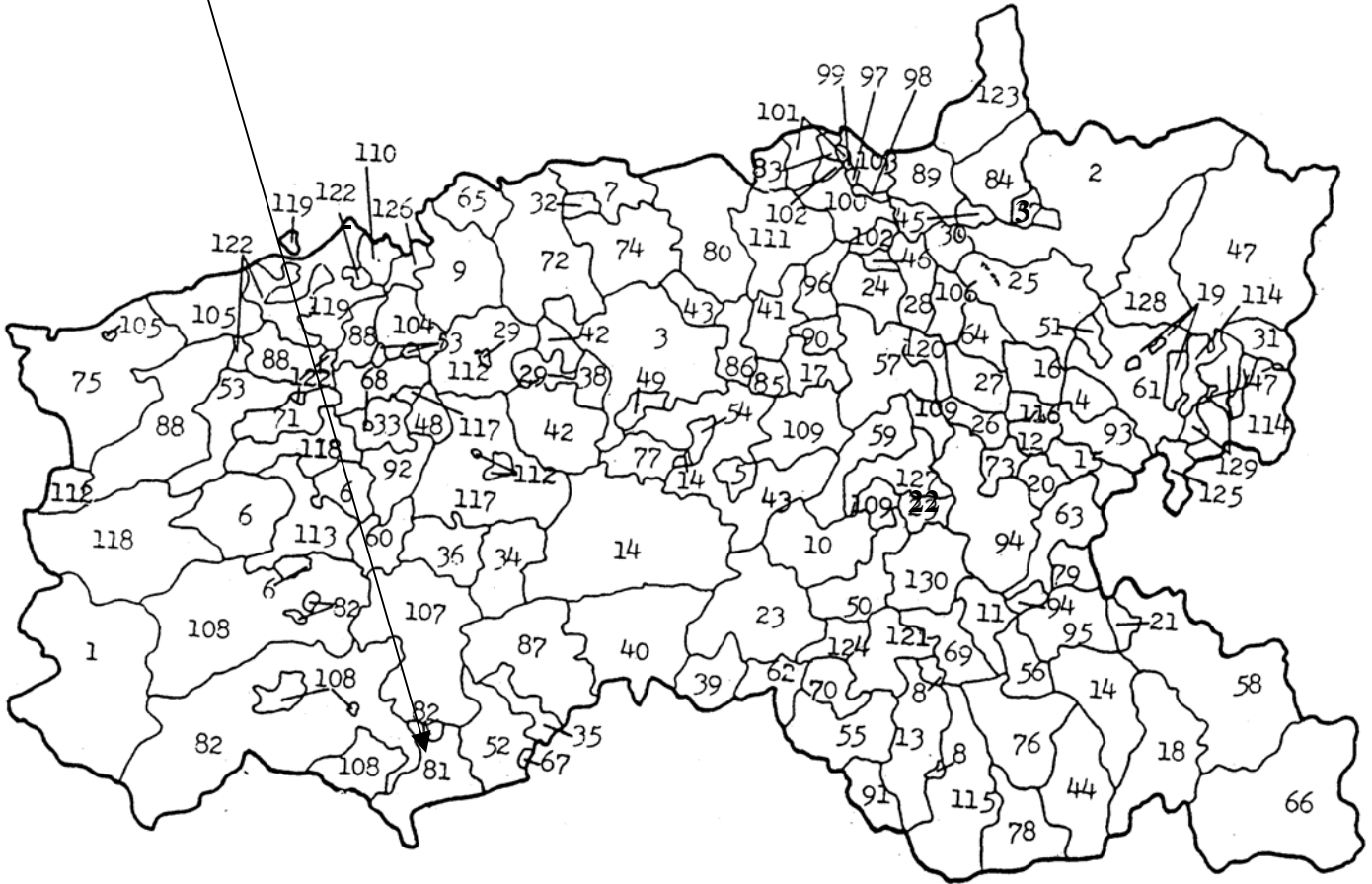

This parish is bounded on the N.W. by Killeedy Ph. and the Ph. of Newmarket in the County of Cork; on the N. by Fahoona Ph.; on the E. by Drumcullaheer Ph.; and on the S. by the County of Cork.

It contains 4848 a. 3 r. 12 p., including land and water. Its eastern and northern parts are well cultivated; its southern and western parts are mountainous. It contains a Church and 2 R. C. Chapels. The latter are in Broadford Village; the former is in Springfield Td., a little to the S. of the Castle.

This townland is situated $1\frac{1}{4}$ mile S.E. of Broadford Village. It is bounded on the N. and W. by Farrihy Td.; E. by the Ph. of Drumcullaher; and S. by Tullylease Ph., in the County of Cork.

It is the property of the Revd. Richd. Plumer, and contains 495 statute acres. The greater part of it is under tillage and pasture. A bye-road to Drumcullaher passes through it. Near its centre is an ancient fort.

This townland is $\frac{1}{2}$ mile S. of Broadford Village. It is bounded on the N. by Tullaha Td.; E. by Farrihy Td.; W. by the Tds. of Lacka Upper and Lower; and S. by the County of Cork.

It is the property of John Keating and Francis Sullivan, Esqrs., and contains 408 statute acres. It is chiefly under tillage and pasture; but there are a few patches of rough pasture land interspersed through it. It is divided into two distinct parts, called Boolabrien and Boolacollata. It contains Toberna-stooka well, a glen called Glenacappul, and Glenview Lodge.

It is the property of Lord Muskerry, and contains 1,030 statute acres. All under tillage and pasture; no bog. Broadford Village is situated on the boundary of this townland and Tullaha. Its northern boundary is the road leading from this village to Drumcullagher. It also contains Prospect Lodge. Subdivisions of this td. are Ankettle's Farrihy and Gun's farrihy.

This townland is the property of Mrs. Jerry Sullivan. The greater part is mountain ground. In its northern extremity stand the ruins of the Church of Killagholehane, with its graveyard attached. Lump rent - £86. This td. contains 165 statute acres.
