Bounded on the N. by the Phs. of Effin and Ballingaddy; E. by the Ph. of Kilquane in the County of Cork; and W. and S. by the Ph. of Doneraile, County of Cork.

It contains 2,345 acres, statute measure, ½ of which is arable land, and the other ½ is a mountain of a boggy nature. The leading road from Charleville to Kilfinnan, bearing N.E. and S.W., passes through the parish nearly about the centre. The only remains of antiquity in the parish are Kilquane Old Church, Ballyshaneboy Castle, and several forts. The highest point of land in the parish is Jamestown, 1450 ft. above the sea. The lowest point is Ballyhunta, 394 ft. above the sea.

Situated in the west of the parish. Bounded on the N. by Newpark Td. and by Ballymacshaneboy Td. in Effin Ph.; N.E. and E. by the tds. of Ballincarroona and Ballyhaght; W. by Ballylopen Td. (Kilquane Ph., Co. Cork); and S. by the td. of Ballyshandehey.

Is the property of Francis Green, Esq., Spring Hill, Cove, Co. Cork. It contains 702 acres, all arable with the exception of a portion of mountain towards the South. There are 4 forts in the td. About the centre of the td. is a road leading from Charleville to Kilfinnan. A small river runs N.E. and S.W. across the td. There are several car tracks leading to the mountain.

Is the property of Richard Maxwell, Croom, and contains 341 acres. The half towards the S.E. is wood & mountain; the other half is arable. There is a fort in the W. of the td. The road from Charleville to Kilfinnan crosses the td. Somewhat to the West, near the centre, between the arable and mountain, stands the wood.

Is the property of George Chapman, Esq., Fermoy. It contains 402 acres, statute measure. Half is arable land, the other half is mountain. The road from Charleville to Kilfinnan crosses the td. About the centre, to the S.E. of the road, stand a graveyard and the ruins of Kilquane Church. There are 2 Trigl. Station here, Ballyhunta 398 feet, and Carrig 983 feet, above the sea level.

Is the property of John Crone, Esq., Byblox. It contains 821 acres. Half is arable; the other half is mountain. The leading road from Charleville to Kilfinnan crosses the td. about the centre. East of this road, and about the centre of the td., is an ancient fort. In the E. of the td. is Jamestown Trigl. Station, 1450 ft. above sea level.
