This parish is bounded on the N. by the phs. of Cahercorney and Monasteranenagh; W. by Ballynagallagh Td., and by the Phs. of Bruff and Uregare; S. by Athneasy Ph.; and E. by the phs. of Hospital, Ballynamona and Kilcullane. Contains 9,248 acres.

This parish is situated 25 miles S.W.by S. of Hospital, and 3 miles E. of Bruff. It is about 3 miles in length by about 21 miles in breadth. The land is in general good, and is under tillage and pasture. There is a small tract of bog. Lough Gur partly belongs to this parish. Here are the ruins of several castles, & the village of Enockainey stands on the banks of the Commogue River.

#### Druidic Circle

Situated in the N.W. end of the td. of Loughgur, and a short distance east of a larger circle of stones, and 171 chains S.W. of Loughgur Castle (in ruins).

This is a Druidic circle about 50 links in diameter. with a small concentric circle in the centre about 20 links in diameter. These circles are composed of stones only.

#### Druidic Circle

This is a Druidic circle of 150 links in diamter. This circle is composed of stones about one foot in height over the surface and perfectly circular.

#### Giants Grave

#### -- Local

Situated in the N.W. end of the td. of Loughgur, to the south of Lough Gur and about 80 links south of the road.

This is a Giants Grave of great size. It is 30 links in length and 8 links broad. It was originally covered overhead with 3 massive flag stones, of which 2 are now displaced. The largest, which is in the middle, measured 7 ft. in length, 4 ft. in breadth, and 1 ft. 6 inches in thickness.

#### Giants Grave

#### -- Local

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Situated in the north end of the td. of Ballynagallagh, about 230 links south of the road leading to Holy Cross.

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This is a Giants Grave, some of the stones of which have been displaced. Three large massive flags now remain.

#### Giants Graves

#### -- Local

Situated in the S.W. end of the td. of Ballynagallagh.

These are 2 Giants Graves, one of which is covered over with 3 large massive flagstones. The other, which is a few chains away from the former, was lately broken down by a farmer to make pillars for his gateway.
