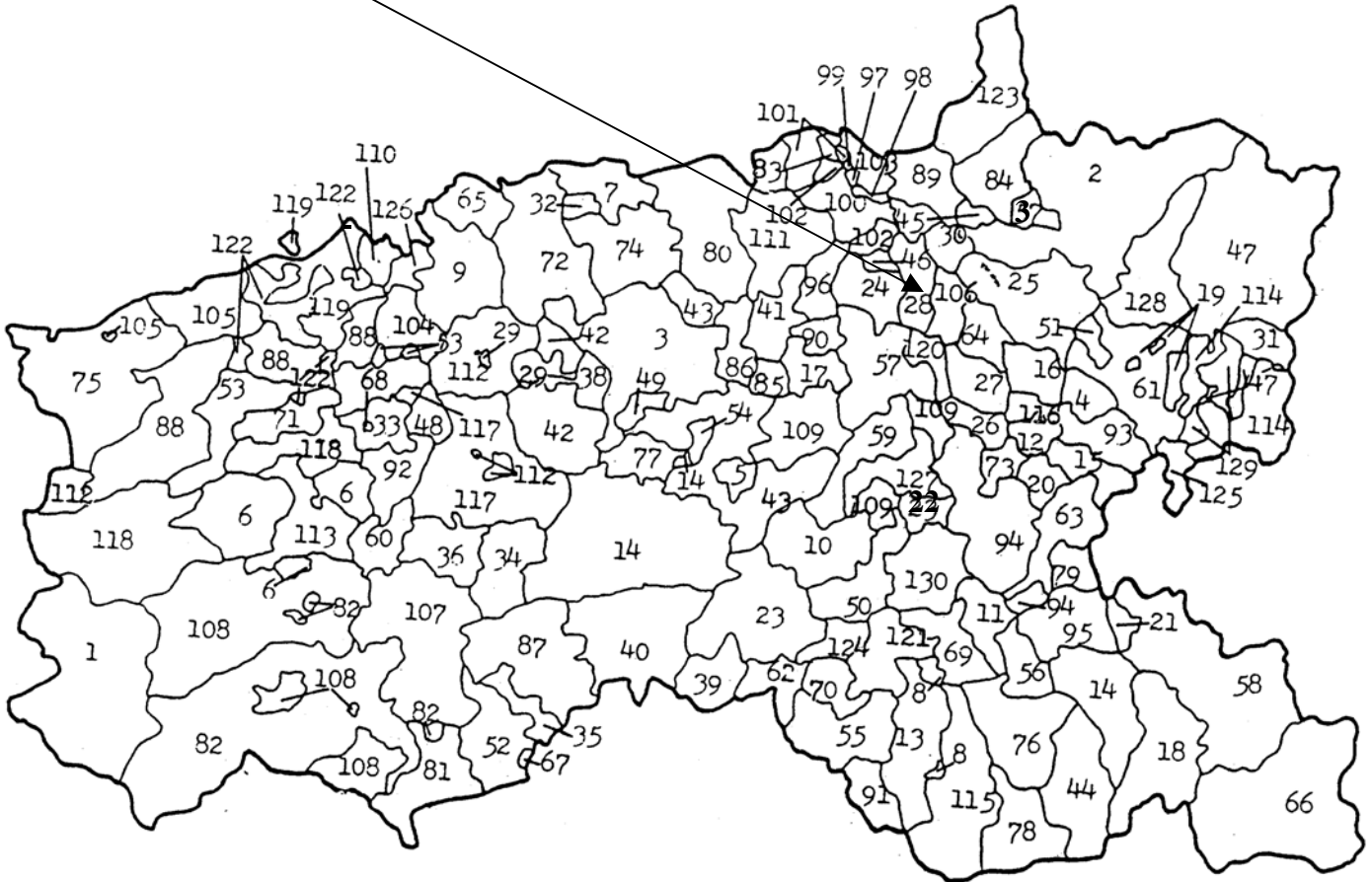

This parish is situated about 5 miles S.E. of the City of Limerick. It is bounded on the E. by the phs. of Inch St. Lawrence and Caherconlish; N. by Carrigparson and Cahernarry phs.; W. by Cahernarry ph.; and S. by the

phs. of Rochestown and Caherelly. It contains 1,954 acres.

It is about 2 miles long and one mile broad, with a hilly surface. Its principal roads are:- one, which bounds part of it on the west side, leading from Limerick to Cork; and another from Croom to Caherconlish, leading E. by W. through its north end.

Situated at the centre of the west boundary of the parish, and contains 455 acres. It is bounded on the E. by the tds. of Luddenbeg and Kilculleen; N. and W. by the ph. of Cahernarry; and S. by the tds. of Stonepark and Luddenmore.

It is arable and without limestone. Soil light and partly gravelly, producing potatoes, corn and flax. The proprietor John Croker and Henry O'Grady Esqrs. The former has part let to 3 tenants at will and at £2 10s. per acre; and the latter to 3 other tenants by leases of one life at £2 15s. per acre. Co. Cess generally 1s.4d. to 1s.8d. per acre half yearly. Tithe 1s.6d. to 10d. per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Matthew Moore, Incumbent, has it let to 2 tenants by a lease of one life at the gross rent of £12. Co. Cess generally 1s.4d. to 1s.8d. per acre ½ yearly. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Situated in the N. end of the parish. Bounded on the E. by the Ph. of Caherconlish; W. and N. by Kilkulleen Td.; and S. by Inch St. Lawrence Td.

This Glebe contains 14 acres, which are arable. Soil partly deep, without limestone, producing potatoes, corn and flax. The proprietor, the Revd. M. Moore, has it let to one tenant at will and at £3 per acre. Co. Cess generally 1s.4d. to 1s.6d. per acre half yearly. Tithe none.

This td. contains 132 acres, which are arable, with limestone. Soil light and gravelly, producing potatoes, corn and flax. The proprietor, Henry O'Grady, Esq., has it let to Richard Rice, Esq., by a lease of one life at £1 5s. per acre, and he again to 11 tenants for same tenure at £2 15s. per acre in farms of 16 to 1½ acres. Co. Cess generally 1s.4d. to 1s.8d. per acre half yearly. Tithe 1s.8d. per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce.

Situated in the south end of the parish. Bounded on the E. by the ph. of Inch St. Lawrence; W. by Stonepark Td.; N. by Luddenbeg Td.; and S. by the ph. of Caheravally.

This td. contains 437 acres, which are arable and without limestone. Soil light and gravelly, producing potatoes, corn and flax. The proprietor, Jno. Kelly, Esq., has it let to 11 tenants by leases of 1 life at £1 12s. per acre in farms of 10 to 50 acres. Co. Cess generally 1s.4d. to 1s.6d. per acre half yearly. Tithe 1s.6d. to 2s. per acre. Bog used for fuel is very scarce. Prevailing Names: Magrath.

Burial Ground (Eng.) -- Inhabitants

Situated in the N. part of Kilculleen Td.

"Kyle" is placed in a cultivated field. It is of a circular form, about 1 chain in diameter, and not much higher than the surface of the field. It is green, and has not been used for internments since about the

years 1780 or '90, at which time it was used only for children. There are some stones, weeds, &c. on its surface.

Imaginary (Eng.) -- Inhabitants

Situated in the centre of Luddenmore Td.

This is an obelisk, about 21 ft. high and 8 ft. in diameter, terminating in a point. It was built in 1827 by the proprietor, Jno. Kelly, Esq. It is placed on the summit of a high hill, from which is an extensive view. On this hill, while the workmen were digging for stone, &c., they turned up a quantity of human bones so numerous that they quitted digging there.

Ballymacreese House -- Local 13

Situated on and near the centre of the west boundary of Ballymacreese Td., and south of the road leading from Croom to Caherconlish.

This residence is the seat of Mr. James Shine, and was rebuilt in 1829 at the expense of about £900. It is 3 story high.

Ludden Church -- Local 14

Situated near the centre of the td. of Luddenbeg, and about 1 chain south of the road from Croom to Caherconlish.

This burial ground, which is enclosed by a wall, is a square of about 4 chains side. In its centre is the ruin of a Priory, about 40 by 20 ft. and 10 ft. high, overgrown with ivy.
