

The property of Count De Salis, England, containing 1,098 acres, including 62½ acres of water, about 500 acres of demesne, and the remainder arable land. In the N. of the td. is Grange House. In the S.E. is Grange Hill House as well as a Roman Catholic Chapel and Burial-ground. On the W. boundary are 2 forts and a druidical remains. On the E. boundary is a part of Lough Gur. In the centre is a Trigl. Station, named Grange Hill.
