This was Ferris' description of him. His son John Fitz Gibbon, the famous Earl of Clare was born here. Although in a ruinous state, it is still beautiful. Was destroyed during civil war. At that time it was owned by an American millionaire named Nevins, who turned the former ice house into a mausoleum, where members of his family are buried.

Begun by Mrs LUCILA LARIOS & TASHARA HICKIE in fulfilment of a promise made while on a visit to Lourdes, it was completed by her three sons General Sir William; General Carlos & Mr Manuel D. Hickie. It is of extremely stylish workmanship & built entirely from funds provided by the Hickie family, SLEVOIR HOUSE, BORRISokane.

I Represents a very pretty scene. This river known as the Owenanan traverses the entire length of Glenanan. The bridge in back, if it can be seen, is the scene of Edmond Comors' meeting with "Ellis" Bloumfer" Daly (Baron Sheehans' "Glenanan") The banks are nicely planted & great masses of mountain ash in full berry overhang the stream, the waters of which are a dark brown colour, & its bed strewn with huge boulders of red sandstone.

II Glenanan taken from hillside to north. The deep ravine traversed by the river is shaded by the trees.

III Overlooking the valley or gap where Ellahan met his death, is BUITRENT Mountain. Its name is due to the fact that dispossessed tenants were allowed access to mountain free of charge, provided they reclaimed it.
