From hill to north of Hospital a magnificent view may be obtained of the delightful Glen of Aherlow, comprising many thousands of acres and stretching east and south to the foot of the Galtee mountains. Glen beautifully wooded, and watered by three pretty rivers, Aherlow, Drumcondra and Mahore.

GEOLOGY

A very good quality marble was quarried in the district of Ballynamona about 100 years ago. Specimens of this marble & some fine slabs may be seen in Ballynamona H., the property of Dr. de Longhlin. The marble was quarried & house built by the Vandeleur family.

KILFRUSH HOUSE. In a well wooded demesne, one mile from Hospital on road to Knocklong. Late Georgian type of architecture. Surrounded by some of the most delightful and charming gardens in Co. Limerick. (Photographed) Houses a splendid collection of old furniture, pictures, etc. Library. Not open to visitors. Owner - Mrs. Gubbins. Built 1825.

KENMARE CASTLE. Adjoining village of Hospital. Entrance from north end of Main St. Comprises portion of a castle built in 1655 by Sir Thomas Browne (ancestor of Lord Kenmare & from which title is taken) castle was originally founded in 1215 by Geoffrey de Marisco (see antiquation). Has good modern library, some good pictures & furnishings & lovely collection of old brass. Splendid gardens. Not open to public. Owners: - Mr. & Mrs. A. P. Reynolds.

Hospital Abbey. Founded 1215 by Geoffrey de Aluisco (fitzmaine) for Knights Hospitallers of Order of St John of Jerusalem. Dissolved in 1541, when Anreas Steffeman the last Preceptor (a man of doubtful character) was made Bishop of Emly on direction of Henry VIII. The Abbey stands beside R. C. church, 86×21 feet. Had two windows in E., one pointed & one defaced. Fine windows in S. wall and doors on either side, 20 feet from west end. Part of the belfry tower stands at W. end. Had two vaulted floors. Remains 30 feet high to S. At east end to left is an effigy of a knight in alto relief, 7 feet high & supposed to be the founder. A grotto has been erected on 1st floor of belfry. Ground floor turned into a vault. In excellent repair & under the Board of Works care. Entrance through yard of R. C. church. At back of Abbey is Hospital burial ground.

KILCULLANE ABBEY. The existing ruin is that of old parish church & dates from the 17th cent. Dating from about 1185. Built mainly of sandstone with red sandstone for arches & windows. After dissolution was granted to Edw. Brown. It had a nave & chancel 33×20 feet and 18×12 feet. Walls 10×3 feet. S. wall down. E & W. ends still stand. All features defaced. Burial place of Bouchier family. Appears to have had some care & is in good state of preservation. Situated on left bank of Camogue river, 400 yards south of the Herbertstown/Holy Cross road. Surrounding ruins is Kilcullane burial ground.

BALLYNAMONA ABBEY. The existing ruin is that of the church dating from 18th cent. Was an ancient parish and dates from early 14th century. Formerly known as Elmoortown. Was a small foundation 30×20 feet approx. The walls to a height of 6 feet only remain. ~~Had very unusual slots running diagonally through walls about 4 feet apart to ground. Not in except of any care.~~ Adjoins the land of Mr. Locke (Plain sheets of foolscap paper to be used, if necessary, for recording additional information).

Important Public Buildings. Hospital.

The R. C. church at Hospital is a massive edifice of very well dressed limestone. Built in 1842. Cuciform. Seating accommodation for about 500 persons. Church has no outstanding features internally. Situated at N. end of Main st of Hospital. Beside it stands the ruin of the old abbey of the Knights Hospitallers of the Order of St John of Jerusalem.

and stands on left bank of Ballynamona river, 300 yards S.W. of Ballynamona cross. Surrounded by a burial ground, in which is the fine vault of the Vandeleur family formerly of Ballynamona House. old ph. church. existing ruin of unbroken dat. but is not ancient

CAHERCORMET ABBEY. Was an ancient parish dating from end of 12th century. Was a very small foundation, measuring 60 x 20 feet. Both ends & sides still stand. Appears to have been built up some years ago as there is no trace of a door or windows in sides. Remains of good pointed window in E gable & narrow slit window in W. gable, 10 feet from ground. From records it would appear it was in disrepair early in 16th century. Sometimes known as Bonne's fort. Monument to Edw. Broke who died in 1723 aged 70. Adjoins public road from Limerick, 1 mile north of Herbertstown village. Surrounded by burial ground not in receipt of any care.

KILFRUSH. In the burial ground in Gubbins demesne at Kilfrush is the foundation only of an early building which records say was an Abbey. Dates from late 13th century. Was plundered & destroyed in the first quarter of 14th century. Nearly is at Colman's well. Burial ground excellently kept. old ph. ch. of no interest.

BALLINARD. Slightly to south of Herbertstown village is the burial ground of Ballinard, wherein was situated an Abbey dating from middle of 13th century. Foundation attributed to Henry III. Was an ancient parish. Also known as Bakerhouse, (Batain Seoige) weasel's fort. No trace now of Abbey but the site is still known as the Old Abbey. old ph. church.

RATHJORDAN. One mile to north east of Herbertstown village is Rathjordan burial ground wherein was an old Abbey, now entirely levelled and no trace remains thereof. Dated from early 14th century & was in the Deanery of Wettney. Nearly is the well of St John the Baptist. No crosses or stones attributed thereto.

CASTLES.

Rawleystown (or Raleighstown) Court. On lands of Mr P. Ryan to east of main road from Ballyneety to Herbertstown. The Rawleys were one of the oldest Anglo Norman families in Limerick, having settled here early in 13th century. Sir Walter Raleigh was believed to have been a member of this branch of the family. It was a tower with turrets at the angles reputed to have been built during reign of James I. Enclosure 180 x 120 feet appross. Inside was a strong house 80 x 30 feet. It was granted to Lord Kingston towards end of 17th century, who sold to the Croker family and who held sway in the district up to a few years ago. Only the walls of Court now remain.

BALLYNAMONA CASTLE. Stood near west wall of Ballynamona burial ground. Only a huge lump of masonry now remains. On left bank of Ballynamona River.

CASTLES.

KILCULLANE CASTLE. Slightly to east of Kilcullane Abbey stood the castle of same name. according to records it dated from end of 12th century and was held at a rent of a HAWK and half MARK of silver. Towards end of 13th century it was held by J. Daundon from Sir Thos de Blare at a rent of a pair of FURRED gloves and some pence. Later it passed into the hands of the Browne family. Only an angle of two walls, 6 feet high now remain.

HOSPITAL CASTLE (now known as KENNARE) was founded about 1215 by Geoffrey de Marisco, who also founded the Hospital close by. After the dissolution of the monasteries the castle was granted to W. Apsley and was destroyed in rebellion of 1641. Another castle was built about 1655 by Sir Thos Browne and portion of this latter building is embodied in the house which presently stands on the site and is the residence of Mr & Mrs A. P. Reynolds. (Photographed)

KILFRUSH. A castle once stood at Kilfrush but has long since disappeared. During 16th century it was held by Earl of Desmond.

BALINWARD. Castle stood to north of burial ground. No trace now save hard foundation.

HERBERTSTOWN. A castle one owned by Lord Kingston stood to west of main road at village of Herbertstown. Only faint of masonry remains.

Antiquities

On the lands of Mr Joseph Ballanor at Ballynamona, Hospital, is the major portion of a stone circle, some 38 yards in diameter. It lies about 50 yards to east of Linenek / Hospital road at back of some cottages. Land about it is presently under com.




