TOPOGRAPHY

Brief description of outstanding scenic views in the district, natural attractions, or unusual topographical features.

The best scenic views in above Parish can be obtained from the 1440^{ft} Knockroo Hill - between the villages of Old & New Kildimo. A similar view can be got from the hill above Dromore Castle. Galtymore's lofty peak shoots up from the level uninteresting Limerick plain, while the dim & misty Moylussa & Tountinna Summits - in Clare & Tipperary stand like mighty sentinels guarding the Fortress of King Brian Boru, and the lovely Shannon. From the top of Ringmoyle old windmill the aerodrome of Rhinanna and the seaplane base at Foynes present an interesting view when the Planes are "touching down" & "taking off."

GEOLOGY

Brief notes on unusual geological features, such as caves, eskers, etc.

There are no unusual geological features, Eskers or Caves. Limestone prevails all over this Parish, with a sprinkling of Sandstone, Greenstone & shale around Ringmoyle and Pallaskerry townlands. There are good gravel & sand pits in the East, with rich alluvial land along the Shannon & Maigue Estuaries. There are very good patches of meadow & red tillage land in the S-west part of the Parish. Turf or Peat deposits do not exist. It is fairly well wooded, and timber is the only fuel there at present.

"Dromore Castle" built by the Earl of Limerick 1854 at a cost of £80,000. Present owner - Mr H. McMahon, Timber merchant, Limerick, who purchased the Castle in 1941 - the price I am told was £8,000 - The Castle is an exact replica of Dragenfeld Towered Castle on the Rhine. Built of cut stone & rubble on a precipitous limestone crag overhanging a lake, it presents a stately & majestic appearance to the traveller. The ancient Castles of Bolane & Carrigogune - semi-distant to the East & West - look like sentries of the past guarding an architectural masterpiece of the present. When viewed by the Tourist from the 1/4 mile Kildimo village, the ancient and modern Castles are silhouetted against a western wooded hill top and present a weird & striking picture. A flight of steep steps lead from the Castle crag to the lake below. There are numerous wooded walks, an avenue & garden. The approximate Castle - with enclosed courtyard - measurements are 100' x 90'. It has a varied assortment of windows and gives the outside impression of being badly lighted. Inspection - though not strictly forbidden - is not encouraged by present owner, whose absence from home on my two visits prevented exterior, & curtailed exterior inspection.

- (1) "Colum Castle" - 200 Yards to South of Ferrybridge village on the main Limerick, Kildimo Road. All that remains of this historic Castle is the 24' Gable and 11' of side walls. The height would be about 35'. The Gable is cracked in centre - otherwise it is holding out well against time & weather. Some of the staircase outlines can be seen. It was once a large structure (if judged by the outline foundations). It is not wymantled. Supposed to have been built by the Fitzgeralds in 1657. It was besieged and captured by Sir Hardress Waller who hanged the garrison of 150 men.
- (2) "Court Castle" directly opposite Colum Castle on other side of main Road. It is built on the banks of River Maigue, measures 27x24 by 20' high, has a circular south gable, the western arched doorway measures 5'x4'. South gable is cracked it has 2. Slitted splayed windows, also 2 similar windows - one splayed outwards - on the north wall (Gable). Ground apartment is intact and measures 10x10 with 18' high corbelled roof. Staircase is gone. There are western & eastern buttresses or proops. It is much wred and has no local history, supposed to be a Fitzgerald castle.
- (3) "Bolone Castle" located on a steep crag 1/4 mile west of main Kildimo, Askeaton Road and one mile from Kildimo. It measures 29x24 by 50' high. The ground apartment measures 20x15 by 20' high to corbelled roof. This chamber has two S.S. East, 2 West and 1 South windows. Staircase is gone, walls are 6" thick. The two upper apartments are unroofed. South side of castle has three slitted splayed windows, and a fairly large square one near the castle top. There is another S.S. window neatly placed in S. west corner. What remains of this castle is in a very good structural condition. It is built on a crag which slopes abruptly to the North. It has no local history. It has a square turret with four small windows on top of castle.
- (4) Ballyculhane or Fahy Castle located in townland of same name - 1 MILE N.EAST of Kildimo. This castle has completely fallen away leaving only high court yard walls, and outside foundation outlines of what was once the castle measuring 70x50'. The enclosed courtyard measures 140^{ft} x 115^{ft}. The courtyard has a southern gateway, with small spiral staircases leading up to what must have been turrets or watchtowers on the N.E. S.E. & S.W. corners. Ballyculhane is the most historic of the castles of above Parish. The English besieged it in 1581. In 1582 O'Brien of Carrigogonnell assisted the English in a successful attack, a breach was made and the defending garrison annihilated. Local historians say that O'Brien did not help his English allies, but helped himself to some hundreds of cattle etc. It is reputed to be a Desmond castle and now owned by a Mr Guinane.

EXTRACT FROM LETTER RECEIVED ON 9/12/41 FROM
GERRARD O'MOORE, Ballinacarriga, Kildimo, Co. Limerick:-

"By the way there is a place near here which I never see mentioned in Guide-books as a place of historical importance or otherwise. I think it is a pity because one of our great Fenian tales has its setting there, that is An Bruidhem Chaorthain or in English "The Fairy Palace of the Quicken tree." I saw once in a book that it was situated in the Barony of Caonrai, but I could go nearer than that. It is in the townland of Rockfield, and the remains of it are still to be seen today. It is circular in shape and about 75 yards across. Built of stone, the highest part of the wall which remains is about 14 feet high. Hope to see you make mention of it soon."

Mr. Duignan (National Museum) tells me that they have no record of a fort in this locality. He has asked the Board of Works, which can throw no light on the subject. None of the recognised authorities identify any particular fort with the "bruidheann Caorthain" of the Fenian tale.

(5) "Carrigogune Castle" (or Shan Talles)

Located $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to west of Dromore Castle and $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to west of Bolane Castle. This old Castle must have been very massive when the Courtyard ^{wall} measures $180^{\text{ft}} \times 170^{\text{ft}}$ by 25^{ft} high. The Castle is enclosed by a western projection of Courtyard, and measures (approx) $27' \times 24' \times 50^{\text{ft}}$ high. The western neat pointed arched entrance door - which measures $6' \times 2'$ gives access to a square porch with a passage to the right, and a similar door in centre leading into a ground chamber which measures $15' \times 13\frac{1}{2}'$ by 20^{ft} high. A good corbelled roof covers this apartment. In the circular roof there is a circular incision which might measure $10' \times 1\frac{1}{2}'$ - a characteristic I have not noted in any other old Castle - There is another ground chamber with a southern entrance which measures $11' \times 9'$. The upper chambers of Castle have fallen away, and the only portion of circular stone staircase that remains, leads downwards from the sleep crag on which Castle is built, to the level green fields below. There are the usual dilted splayed windows, - with one square arched larger top one - peeping through their mantle of Ivy. A square hole is seen on the 2nd floor, which is probably a shot hole over a door, but which locals hold was the "gallows". I could get no local history of this Castle - beyond its Desmond origin - The condition of the remaining masonry is fairly good - likewise the Courtyard. It would be difficult to reconstruct the plan of this Castle, which is presently owned by a MR HOGAN

Old Churches

Ardenney or Mellon Church

This old church measures 57' x 18" with a western porch of 9 x 9. It has the usual Eastern Gable window and west door and Belfry.

There were two windows in North and two in South walls. It has not a large crop of ivy on its walls, neither does it appear very ancient. The graves in adjoining cemetery are very unkept, and show no interesting tombstones.

Old Kildimo Churchyard

Has no old church, no remarkable tombs, and the whole outline of this Graveyard is unkept and forgotten looking.

Chapel Russel Churchyard

The Church of Ireland building within the walls of the Graveyard is still in use,

Protestants & Catholics share a common clay, and neither seem to pay any wordly tribute to their deceased relatives whose graves are unkept & forgotten

Ancient Churches

"Kilulta" or Bolane Church — Prehistoric.

Located 100 yards on west side of main Kildimo Foynes road — near the road junction for Tullaskenny, and in townland of Bolane. It is built on a craggy limestone hill, and the stranger travelling along the nearby public road would not distinguish it from an ordinary limekiln, and would not in any way arouse his curiosity.

The interior measurements of this ancient church are $16\frac{1}{2}^{\text{ft}}$ x 10^{ft} by $8\frac{1}{2}^{\text{ft}}$ high. The Eastern — or Altar — Gable ~~is intact~~ and two side walls are intact and the western Gable is likewise as far as the wallplate. The roof is gone. The Eastern Gable window which starts $4' 3''$ from the ground measures $4' 2''$ splayed to $8''$ outwards. There is a primitive doorway with a stone lintel and no Arch, neither is there an Arch over the Eastern window. The Stones ~~are~~ used in its construction are large and rough.

This Primitive Church is supposed to be the oldest in Ireland, some say it dates back to St. Patrick's time.

It is in charge of the "Office of Public Works," who have erected a Door bar to prevent cattle entering the edifice. Crude tombstones can be located around the old Church.

Reference Westropp's Ancient Castles of Co Limerick
160 "Ballyculhane" (12) - A Seat and Stronghold of the
Turcells (NORMANS) from a very early date, who continued
in possession down to the middle of 17th Century.

The Castle consists of a court 195^{ft} across, walls 30^{ft}
high, It had towers at the angles, An oblong "Castle"
or Strong house stood detached to north. The fosse
could be flooded from the nearby River Maigue.

162 "Court" (12) - Dates from the end of 16th Century

A low well preserved peel tower with slight projecting
turrets to E & west, between which the south wall is
curved. In N.E. angle is a broken stairway. North
wall has batter (slope) to each side of plain pointed
doorway. Windows are rude and plain. Lower story
vaulted, believed to have been built by Mac Gibbon.

163. Bolane (12) Dates from end of 15 Century, and was for
a Geraldine stronghold. A tall peel tower - one side of
which is in good repair to its full height, the opposite
side which had a stairway to left, is levelled. Had
two vaults and an upper room, Masonry and features
are good, of well cut limestone. The usual Lombic
(recesses) occur, also angle slits. There was a slight turret
at battlement, stands on a low rock overlooking the
Maigue valley to South and Co. Clare to North.

164 Collum (12) - Northern wall stands near R. Maigue
but all its features are defaced. Lower story was
vaulted.

Carrigogwne or Shan Tallas - cannot be traced
in "Westropp's Ancient Castles", and the map which
you supplied me with, does not show it, ^{which} this seems
extraordinary as this castle (or Court) is one of the largest
specimens in Kildimo Parish.
