## Killaloe Girl's Death

I regret to write our Killaloe correspondent to announce the death of Marie Elizabeth M'Keogh, nine years of age, eldest daughter of Mr and Mrs James M'Keogh, Ballina, which took place at 10.30 on Monday evening, 27th March, 1916, in the 19th inst. Indeed it came as a surprise to the people to hear of the unexpected death of this lovely little girl, who, like a blooming rose, was the very picture of health. Perhaps too good for this earth, and while yet pure and innocent it pleased God to take this darling child to her home in heaven. Needless to say the sympathy of the entire community goes out to the afflicted parents in their sorrow for the loss they have sustained. The remains arrived at Killaloe by train from Dublin at 7 o'clock on Monday evening, and the very large crowd which awaited the funeral and marched the little coffin to the Ballina Parish Church for interment. The funeral took place in which Mr and Mrs M'Keogh are held. There was solemn Requiem Mass on Tuesday at 10.30 a.m. at which the following congregation was present, after which the coffin took place to the family burial ground in the churchyard.
