LIMERICK COUNTY COUNCIL.

Maintenance of Live Stock (Ireland) Order of 1915.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Maintenance of Live Stock Act, 1915, and for the purpose of maintaining a sufficient stock of animals, do hereby order as follows:

ANIMALS IN CALF OR IN PIG NOT TO BE SLAUGHTERED OR EXPORTED.

1. An animal which is visibly or obviously in calf or in pig shall not (a) be slaughtered, or be caused or permitted by its owner to be slaughtered; or (b) be moved out of Ireland, or be caused or permitted by its owner to be moved out of Ireland.

EXCEPTIONS FROM RESTRICTIONS.

2. The restrictions imposed by the foregoing Article shall not apply to—(a) the slaughter of an animal under the powers conferred by the Diseases of Animals Act, 1914, or any Order made thereunder; or (b) the slaughter of an animal necessary or desirable on account of accidental injury to the animal or its disease; or (c) slaughter or movement out of Ireland of an animal if in the opinion of the Department the slaughter or movement out of Ireland is desirable for any exceptional reason or purpose and the slaughter or movement is authorized by a license granted by the Department or officer of the Department.

POWERS OF INSPECTORS.

3. Any Veterinary Inspector of the Department, or subject to the direction of the Department, any Inspector of a Local Authority may enter any slaughterhouse or other premises on which animals are slaughtered for food, and examine any animals, or carcasses therein.

DEVOICATION.

4. The Slaughter of Animals (Ireland) Order of 1915 is hereby revoked.

APPLICATION OF ORDER.

5. This Order applies to Ireland.

INTERPRETATION.

6. In this Order "the Department" means the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland; "Local Authority" means the Local Authority under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1914, or 1911; "Animals" means cattle, sheep, and swine.

COMMENCEMENT.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of September, Nineteen hundred and fifteen.

SHORT TITLE.

8. This Order may be cited as the MAINTENANCE OF LIVE STOCK (IRELAND) ORDER OF 1915.

In witness whereof the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland has hereunto set its Official Seal this twenty-fourth day of August, Nineteen hundred and fifteen.

The Swedish Government has prohibited the export of sheep and goats. A Resonance butcher has paid £40 for a stall for his stall, weighing 10 lbs. As many as 5,000 German school teachers have fallen in the present war. There are 18,321 German war prisoners in Great Britain and 31,181 interned aliens. The French have built a new aeroplane which is supposed to be the fastest air machine yet invented and from which remarkable things are expected. For refusing to add a pound of butter to a Food and Drugs Inspector, on the plea that the price was sold, a Dublin dealer was fined £5 on Wednesday. At Kenilworth on Wednesday last, signs reading "pictures" were seen in the streets. Over £2,000 was paid to small farmers and outgoers for their pigs. In the Glasgow Sheriff's Court on Wednesday a trader was fined £5 for having exposed for sale eggs which the label described "fresh eggs" which were not fresh. A two weeks' successful harvest conducted at Lislov by Rev. Father Hourke, Killybeg, and Father, the Rev. Father Hourke, Lislov, was closed on Sunday last. A security of wedding rings is said to be the latest craze. It is reported that many jewelers are now making these plain gold bands only half the usual thickness. The Press Association was informed on Wednesday night by the Secretary of the Railway Executive Committee that it has been decided to raise the fares of tourist tickets as from the 1st of May. Benedict Coffey, O.F.M., Guardian of the Irish Franciscan College at St. Idolors, Monaghan, who is a native of Kenilworth, has volunteered as chaplain, and is attached to the British Navy in the Atlantic. CABINET CRISIS. A Grave Situation. Statements in Parliament. In the House of Commons on Wednesday Mr. Asquith said there were still points of disagreement in the cabinet. He did not see that the unanimous opinion of the Cabinet, would be a national disaster. The Premier added that with the hope of a general election, the Government would be glad to adjourn the House until Tuesday next instead of the original motion for adjournment on May 19th. Sir Edward Carson consented to this course, on the understanding that the change of date should not prejudice his rights to move the resolution which stood up in his name for yesterday. In the House of Lords, the Marquis of Crewe read a copy of the statement made by Mr. Asquith in the Commons, and appealed the circumstances to Lord Milner to postpone the debate on his motion for compulsory service. Lord Milner intimated that he would prefer to continue the debate in a committee. He did not see that the motion would prejudice the Government. Lord Lansdowne, in the course of a long statement, declared that the Government had failed to come to agreement with regard to the cabinet. He did not see that the position, and there was reason to fear that, if they failed to come to agreement, the Government would be glad to adjourn the House until Tuesday next instead of the original motion for adjournment on May 19th. Ultimately Lord Milner consented to the postponement of the debate.
