IRISH WOOL PURCHASE IMPORTANT COMMUNICATION

From War Department. At the monthly meeting of the British Wool Growers' Association held on Thursday, a letter was received from the Chief Executive Officer (Ireland) War Department, Wool Purchase Office, 101, Grafton-street, Dublin, stating that with reference to the resolution of the British Wool Growers' Association, a copy of which had reached the War Department on the 23rd inst., he had the honor to inform the Council that subject to the price that has been settled gentlemen who have hitherto carried on the business of wool dealers were now at liberty to purchase.

A further letter, dated 2nd August, stated that there was no intention of interfering with the customary business of wool dealers, and subject to the conditions as to the prices and rates which have been published by the Army War Department, the buying of wool would proceed as usual. It was expected that some more Irish firms would be included in the list of recognised wool dealers. A circular was issued with the letter stating that persons purchasing wool from farmers in the undermentioned counties must pay to the farmer the full value of his wool calculated on the basis of the value of his wool in the market. These prices are minima rates—that is to say rates for the best wool of each class in the market. For all other classes of wool, the price shall be calculated on the basis of the price for washed or unwashed fleeces in good condition set out in the said schedule. Dealers—that is to say persons who have been in the habit of purchasing wool from sheep in Ireland—are now at liberty to commence buying. They can sell, be it remembered, only to merchants who are recognised by the War Department as acting on its behalf. A preliminary list of whom is given. The price to be paid for wool shall be calculated on the basis of the price for washed wool, and will include a fixed rate of commission for weighing and collecting the wool. Persons other than dealers can purchase wool from sheep in Ireland, but they must be authorised by special permit, unless the wool is merely required for use in domestic workshops.
