An Express from America, by way of Cork, passed through this city for London, on Friday, the contents of which have not transpired further, than that the intelligence was not by any means of a favourable nature, it is said this dispatch came by a vessel arrived at Kinsale from New York in 26 days.

Extract of a letter from Chester, Nov. 15 "I am extremely happy to inform you, that fourteen of the Jamaica, fleet arrived at Liverpool on Wednesday, and the remainder are hourly expected. The Jamaica, Fletcher, of that port foundered on her passage."

Friday an express was received from Kinsale with an account that 61 sail of the homeward bound Jamaica fleet were safe arrived in that harbour.

Sunday the Fanny of Dublin, Graham, from Jamaica, with rum, being one of the large fleet from that Island, arrived safe in this port.

By a letter from Mountmellick, we have an account of a mad dog having bit 15 men, women and children near that town; four of the unfortunate sufferers have since died, and the remainder are in daily expectation of meeting the same fate.

His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant has been pleased to issue his Majesty's writ of Ad quod Damnum to be issued for the holding two additional yearly fairs at the town and lands of Tallow, in the county of Waterford, viz. on every 8th day of December, and 1st day of March, for ever.

HOUSE OF COMMONS.

Saturday, Nov. 17.

Committee of Ways and Means sat, made some progress.

Speaker took the chair.

Mr. Foster moved the order of the day.

Sir Lucius O'Brien, with his usual perspicuity, stated the great advantages that would arise to this kingdom whenever a peace took place, by encouraging a trade with Spain, he therefore proposed, that a clause should be inserted in the wine duties, to reduce the duty on Spanish wines, whenever a negotiation with that country was carried into effect.

Mr. Fitzgibbon was against admitting such a clause, and was for putting an end at once to the Spanish business.

Mr. Bosche asked the Hon. Baronet (Sir Lucius O'Brien) if the clause had any tendency to, or could it in the least impede, our present negotiation with Portugal.

Sir Lucius O'Brien, declared he had no such idea.

Mr. Foster spoke against the clause, as did Capt. Burgh, Mr. Eden, and Mr. Malton. After a very desultory conversation the clause was given up.

Monday, Nov. 19.

Mr. Foster reported the 3 money bills, viz the bill for granting certain duties, aids, and impositions, as therein mentioned, the Stamp act, and the hereditary revenues on beer, wine, cyder silver lace, &c.

Mr. Langrishe moved, that a clause of provision be inserted in the Stamp act, to exempt the books and proceedings, of corporations, and admission of members, from the stamp duties. This occasioned some debate but being agreed on both sides, that there ought to be as in England, the motion was not insisted on, and the three bills were ordered to be transmitted.

The Favorite privateer, of Dunkirk, mounting eighteen six and nine pounders, was drove on shore near Dunkirk, on Tuesday last, and totally lost, and nine of the crew were drowned.

The Belliqueux frigate privateer of twenty-six guns, commanded by Capt. St Pierre, was entirely lost with the crew on the rocks off Cape La Hogue, in a violent storm on Sunday morning the 4th instant; two casters in company could afford no assistance.

Advice is received from Aberdeen, that the high winds have done a great deal of damage amongst the shipping on that coast; that two Dutch privateers, which were cruising in the North Seas, were driven on shore, entirely lost, and the crews drowned; that a great deal of damage was done on shore along the coast; several dwelling houses and out houses were blown down, and many lives lost.

A Spanish Transport, loaded with warlike stores, bound from Laredo to Cadix, is taken in the Bay of Biscay by the Effingham Privateer, and is carried into St. Mary's Scilly: she had sailed from Laredo but a few hours under Portuguese colours before the Privateer fell in with her.

A private letter from Lisbon says, "the refusal of the court in so peremptory a manner to that part of the memorial of the French Ambassador which demanded that all American ships shall have free entrance in our ports and the same favours, &c. as granted to your nation, is likely to be attended with more serious consequences than at present we are aware of."

A gentleman at Paris, in his letter to his brother at Orend says, "I have been at last taken in with some cursed American paper, for about 200 Louis d'Ors. The banking houses will not give a sou for the whole, as things stand at present, although an actual Congress Band."

Yesterday one man charged another with threatening to blow his brains out; the prisoner said it was owing to a dispute about bad halfpence, of which both were coiners, and he made information of the house where the apparatus was; dispatches were sent, the implements found, and the complainant and prisoner both detained.

Our correspondent at Gibraltar, who is an Officer as intelligent as any in the service, positively says, "that as long as the Bay shall be open, and the garrison supplied with food, fuel, ammunition, and cloathing, Gibraltar is impregnable!—impregnable even against France and Spain"

The last letters from Gibraltar mention, that a violent shock of an earthquake had lately happened at Tangier on the coast of Africa, which overthrew several houses and a great many of the inhabitants were buried in the ruins.

Extract of a letter from Penzance, Nov. 6. "Arrived the True Blue privateer, belonging to Clyde, and has brought in with her the Juffrow Cathrina Elizabeth, Captain Bickerer, from Amsterdam to Boston, laden with silk and baie goods. She sailed on the 30th ult. in company with three others, and was separated the 1st of the present month in a hard gale of wind. The crew say, that they have great reason to believe one was lost, as they saw in the morning several pieces of a wreck, and many dead bodies floating on the waves.

It is said that the fleet which is to convoy the East and West India ships to a certain latitude, will, after leaving them, be sent on the business of relieving the British garrison at Mahon.
