Extract of a letter from Sir Guy Carleton to his Excellency Gen. Wathington, duted New

York, Sept. 12; 1782.

" Partial though our fulpention of bullities may be called, I thought it fufficient to have prevented those cruelties in the Jersics (avowed) which I have had occasion to mention more than once. But if war was the choice I never expected this fulpention thould operate further than to induce them to carry it on as is practiced by liberal minds. I am clearly of opinion withfy or Excellency that mutual agreement is necessary for suspension of bottilines; and that without this mutual agreement, either parly n free to act as each nmy judges spedient ; yet I must at the same time frankly declare to you, that being no longer able to differn the object we convend for, I disapprove of all hostilities, both by land and fee, as they only tend to multiply the miferies of individuals, when the public can year no advantage by fue-

cefs. "As to the Savages, I have the best affurances, that from a certain period not very long after my arrival here, no parties of Indian were fent out, and that mellengers were difpatched to recall those who had gone forth before that time; and I have particular affurances of disapprobation of all that happened to the party on the fine of Sandusky, except fo far as was necessary for felf-defence.
