Refolved, that the proceedings of this day be advertised in all the himerick newspapers,

Refolved, that the thanks of the Governors be given to the Rev. Francis Hewfon, for his charitable offer of acting as affidant Chaplain to this House, and that he be elected a Governor of this Corporation
