

Irish broad cloth, if imported into England, is chargeable with a duty of 2l. 15s. 4d. per yard.

English broad cloth imported into Ireland, pays 6d. per yard duty.

Irish new drapery, (that is fluffs, camlets, poplins, &c.) if imported into England, is chargeable with a duty of 5s. 4d. per yard.

English new drapery imported into Ireland pays 2l. per yard duty.

These are what are called protecting duties, or, in other words, a total prohibition of the manufactures of Ireland, into any part of England.

We are assured an official publication will appear in a few days, from the Court of Lisbon, assigning a true cause for a prohibition being laid on the manufactures of this kingdom; in which the late and present Administration of Great Britain will be exposed in their proper colours.
