

...approval from many intelligent persons in that service, and is certainly a very judicious plan for the support of our national strength. The principal object with every maritime state is undoubtedly the preservation of its naval strength; and therefore our wise administration have very properly turned their attention to the state of the shipping, which in times of peace has usually been suffered to lay in so neglected a condition, that when any important occurrence rendered its exertions at all necessary, or probable, Government have been reduced to the greatest difficulties in procuring hands to repair the shattered vessels, and man them with sufficient force; but it is a part of the present plan, to keep a set of men constantly in the service, who are to be properly distributed through a certain number of ships, where they are to continue for a year, and then are to be changed into others, to remain for the same period, so that the service will always have a number of useful hands employed, and the nation a powerful shield of naval security in good order for its defence.

Extract of a Letter from Leghorn, July 16. "On Sunday last about ten o'clock at night, a violent shock was felt near the sea-side, which was thought to be an earthquake, but the Captain of a ship arrived the day following from Gorgona, thirty miles from this city, reports, that the magazine of that island, in which was a great quantity of powder, was blown into the air. This accident was occasioned by lightning, and three persons lost their lives."
