

Particulars relative to the AFRICAN DIVER.
In addition to the late account of the African Diver, the following particulars relative to his proceeding at the wreck, will not only have the grace of novelty to recommend them to your readers, but will likewise afford such a difference of pleasure, as the human mind generally feels between the best recited account of a martial review, and a real action fought in the field.

Having sailed from Dunleary on Wednesday evening, the 13th instant, they steered for the wreck, and as they had previously placed a buoy on her, and expected no difficulty in finding her out, the weather being fine and moderate, with the additional pleasure of moonlight, but in this they were cruelly disappointed for the piratical marauders of that coast (between Bray and Wicklow, who have been continuing their depredations on the foundered ship ever since the melancholy disaster) had not only carried the buoys off, but cut away every thing above the water's edge, masts and all, which in the least degree could serve as a direction. In consequence of this mischievous transaction, a considerable part of the next day was passed in finding her out, when at length they brought to, and moored their vessel on all fours, nearly along side the wreck. It was now too late to do any work below, but ever a diligent economist of time, he harnessed his carriage, and went down to view her! Here your curious readers will lament with me, that the whole account of her real situation, and the certainty of probability of his future success, cannot now be learned, as on this head (without doubt from prudential motives) he is apparently determined to observe a profound secrecy. By an opportunity almost offensive, I with difficulty obtained the following particulars, viz. That she is docked deep in the sand, lying chiefly on one side; her keel is off, though her hull keeps together, and her rigging spread abroad in confused and entangled heaps on the sand. He saw but one body, and prodigious multitudes of fish. Her cables, anchors and falls, he saw very plainly, and all in a situation recoverable.

—From this man's approved resolution and persevering spirit, not a doubt remains, if he can but obtain one view of this life-hazarding treasure, that he will either send it up, or perish in the attempt. What will greatly facilitate their recovery is, that each chest of dollars has a buoy and buoy-rope to it, these are always coiled up, and made fast to the chest, and on appearance of real danger, it is the gunner's duty to see those chests and ropes placed in such a manner, that in case of shipwreck, those buoys may serve as a direction and means of recovery. If this Officer failed in that part of his duty, through the precipitancy of his fate! in the moment of horror! his death has paid a dreadful atonement! —but if otherwise, 'tis more than probable some of those chests might have been raised. Strong suspicions to this purpose have been entertained by the people in this employment, which were further corroborated by the great number of grapples and grappling irons seen in the wreck, which have been broke off and lost in their attempts to plunder, by the corsairs before alluded to.— On Friday morning, every thing being pre-

This accident however obliges him to renounce their prize for the present; by this time the wind had veered far round to the southward, and a heavy sea tumbling in, rendered it unsafe riding at the wreck; and finding the gale to freshen, with a great appearance of a stormy night, they thought proper to unloose, and run for Dunleary, where they safely arrived the same evening.
