L I M E R I C K.
 Extract of a Letter, received yesterday by a person of Consequence in this City, from the most respectable authority, dated Antwerp Dec. 22, 1784.
 "Every thing is now so embroiled, that all appearances of any accommodation seem impossible, and the German troops (for whose arrival we wait to begin the destructive operations) are expected the latter end of January; though we are at present very close to our Enemies, still both parties remain quiet, and as yet not a drop of blood has been spilt on either side. General D'Alton, is on his way with the troops to this Country, and has the Commission of escorting 30 millions of Florins to Brussels."

Yesterday morning detachments from the 47th regiment commanded by Capt. Fetherstone, and from the corps of Limerick Cavalry, commanded by Colonel Harte, with one piece of Artillery, proceeded for Rossmanaher, in the Co. Clare, in order to prevent a number of persons who had collected for the purpose of demolishing a Bridge lately erected by Henry D'Esterre, Esq; agreeable to Act of Parliament.—On the arrival of the above force, they met with no opposition, in consequence of which they returned to town at night, after leaving a guard of the 47th Regt. at said Bridge.
