The Rt. Hon. L. Gardiner oblerved, that he had intended to have brought the confideration of the woollen manufacture before the Houle upon the broadeft balis, luch as would promite every relief that could be defired; and withed not to be precluded from it by any other member.

Sir J. Parnell replied, that he did not intend or with to interfere with the Rt. Hon. Gentleman's intention, he had already mentioned that his bill went no further than to internal regulations; which, tho' he willed particularly to beneht the Queen's County, yet he would extend to the whole kingdom in general --- one great point of regulation was the establishment of Public Markets for the fale of the cloths .---It was those that fo greatly ferved the Linan branch, and he doubted not would be of equal advantages to that of the woollen. In the progrefs of the bill, he should be very glad of the ailitance of the Rt. Hon. Member or anyother Gentieman in the Houfe.

Mr. Gardiner faid, he had the woollen manulacture to much at heart, that he would gladly still in any thing that could lerve it, though it did not go as far as he could with, For that end, he could with to introduce a staple, and establish a proper number of wool flaplers, to fix the flandard and quality.

Leave was given to bring in the bill, and Sir John Parnel and Mr. Chancellor of the Exchequer, ordered to prepare the fame. Mr. Secretary of State, (Hutchinfon) prefented a petition from the workers of wire in the City of Cork, complaining of the act paffed luft fellion, laying a reftraining duty on foreign wire. The Right Hon, Mr. Gardiner Inid, he had a petition in his hand of a quite contrary nature. It was from the wool-combers, fcribblers, and manufacturers of Dublin; they all agreed that German Wire was not fo good for their use as that made in Ireland, which tho at prefent a little dearer is infinitely better.
