

DUBLIN, March 21.

Late last night a messenger arrived from London, with ALL the Money Bills.

In consequence of an official letter from Mr. Orde, it has been intimated to all the friends of Administration, that their attendance without any excuse, is expected in the House of Commons on Monday the 11th of April, as on that day, a business of the utmost importance will be brought forward.

By a Gentleman that left Paris late on Thursday night last, and arrived here this morning at eight o'clock, we are informed that no foreign Prints have been admitted into any of their coffee-houses, for eight days before he left it, and that double militia is drawn from every village in the kingdom, and magazines erecting in the frontier towns of Flanders, which has rose all kind of provisions to an enormous price particularly forage.

By a letter received this morning from Luxemburg, we learn that 42,000 men had passed through that dukedom, for the Low Countries; that eight regiments more are within a day's march, and that from two to three hundred waggons and cannon pass through daily.

Yesterday forgeries on the National Bank to the amount of 5,000l. were discovered. Three persons have absconded on this account.

On Thursday next his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant will go in the usual state to the House of Peers, and give the Royal assent to the Money Bills, and such others as will be ready on that day.

We are still in the dark, as to the fate of the commercial propositions in the British House of Commons. There are several reasons however, to think they will be carried through by a large majority; one of which is, that a few days ago, a noble Lord here (Earl of Mornington) who has a seat in the English Commons, wrote over to Mr. Pitt to acquaint him, that if his presence was necessary to assist in supporting the propositions he would immediately set off for London, and has just received for answer, that the friends of the measure are sufficiently strong without giving his Lordship the trouble of a journey for the purpose.

So—the tax on advertisements is augmented still further—a penny stamp on every sheet of paper, and 1s. od. on every ten lines of advertisements!—But these News Printers are a troublesome set, and must be silenced some way or other.—They publish country meetings, and Volunteer meetings, and Parliamentary intelligence—they are ever talking of a Parliamentary Reform, and of liberty and all that—they tell tales about certain great men, nay, they sometimes discover the evil deeds of certain great men!—therefore down with the Press.

The inhabitants of Green-street, Little Britain-street, &c. we hear, have petitioned government, to remove the place of execution from the front of the New Prison; which petition, it is said, will be complied with, and, in future, the criminals will be executed at the rear of said building.

A further respite, until the 10th of April next, is granted to Thomas Kean, convicted at the last commission, for the murder of John Coochman in the Tenter Fields.

Yesterday morning, a Charity Sermon was preached in Mary's abbey Meeting-house, by the Rev. Mr. Aldowel; when a collection of 200l. was made, for the support of 20 indigent orphans.

Captain Ashe having, on Saturday last, put into the hands of the Rev. Dease Hoare, the sum of 27l. 4s. 10d. (being the clear produce of the late Charity Play for the Jail, as appears by the Accounts delivered to him at the same time) with a Desire that it may be applied to compounding the Debts of such of the Debtors as are Confined for small Sums, and in such manner as may tend to the enlarging the greatest Number: Mr. Hoare begs their several Creditors to send their Proposals to him in writing, immediately. He, at the same time, laments that the like request which he made immediately after the last Assizes, has not been attended to; and observes to the dilatory or hard-hearted Creditors, that they may possibly lose their whole Debt, a Bill for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors; being now before the sitting Parliament.

N. B. The Debts of the last 79 Persons he enlarged, and which were particularised from time to time in the publick Papers; amounted to 720l. 5s. 6d. and having compounded them for 201l. 0s. 10d. he not only restored such a number to Liberty, to their Families, and to the Publick service; but likewise extricated them from the remaining Ballance amounting to 519l. 4s. 8d.
