mean the bill for crefting turnpikes on all the roads leading to this city ; for this bill, by limitting the powers of county of Dublin Grand Juries to affeis or pretent more than the fum Robert Langrifhe, Efgrs. to be Commifioners of one fhilling and eight-pence per acre, inftead of three shillings and four-pence, which they had heretofore the power to do, and at the fame time containing a fyltem of additional expences on the county, by railing the Treafurer's falary, and appointing a Superpower of the Grand Juries to keep the roads in repair; thus to force us into the necessity of paffing the reprobated turnpike bill I have alluded to.

This bill is highly diffefpectful to the Grand Juries of the county of Dublin, for it obliges every Juror to answer upon oath a number of interrogatories, a matter as difgraceful as it is novel. It takes from the Grand Juries of Kilmainham, than which I never faw any more relpcctable, during the time I acted for a friend of mine as Prefident of the Quarter Sellions there, the power of prefenting for roads; that is, in other words, we will truft you with men's lives, but not with the difpotal of ten pounds.

This bill, if paffed into a law, will be bad precedent ; every county in the kingdom will come for a particular act; fo that you will probably next fellion have thir y-one bills for like purposes. I move, therefore, " That to every absent member throughout the kingyou. Sir, leave the Chair."

Mr. Gardiner replied, that the interrogatories were calculated to prevent any but men of fome property in the county from being on Grand Juries, for he had known prefertments directed to inform you that the affembly is to to the amount of feveral thousand pounds made by men who had not a shilling property in it. -As to this bill being novel in its kind I deny; the County of Dublin, on account of its peculiar circumstances, has always had a separate code of laws from other counties; and I hope it will not be effected arrogance in me to declare, that (an attendance of fifteen years on Grand Juries and Road Accounts having given me fome opportunity to decide) the prefent bill is the beft digefted of any bill of the kind ever brought into the House.

As to the increase of the treasurer's falary, that has been already explained as an act of juffice and compensation for the advantages his predeceffors enjoyed by having money in their hands, all chance of which is precluded by being obliged to lodge all fums in the bank; the neceflity of an atliftant clerk and fupervifor cannot be queftioned, when gentlemen confider that not lefs than three hundred prefentments and affidavits go through their hands to prepare and digett for the Juries. In fhort, I believe, my Hon, Friend's opposition to this Cornet, vice Wemyfs, and a former bill chiefly arifes from his defire to recommend himfelf to the county he wishes late 82d reg.
