The Bill for appointing Committioners to enrastaken, on the competene quire into the fees and perquifites of the inferior departments of the public offices having come down from the Lords with amendments ; a fhort conversation took place on fome of them, particularly on that which gave to the Privy Council a power of controlling the Commiffioners, fo far as to direct objects of their enquiry. On the queftion being put, that this amendment do país, the House divided, when there appeared for the amendment twenty-five, and against it thirteen; but this number not being sufficient to constitute a House, which requires forty Members, they were under the necessity of adjourning till to-morrow, when the bunnefs will be refumed.

D U B L 1 N, May, 3. HOUSE OF COMMONS. Salurday, April 30.

The Houfe fat in Committee on an engroffed Bill from the Lords, to amend the acts for the better regulating the Office of Sheriffs, and afcertaining their Fees, It was afterwards reported, and ordered to be read a third time on Monday next.

The Circular-Road Bill was reported, and ordered to be engrofied.

The Order for going into a Committee on the Cork Bank Bill, being read, the Houfe refolved itfelf therein.

The Right Hon Luke Gardiner in the Chair. Sir Francis Hutchinfon, previous to the readof the Bill, oblerved to the Committee that there was a Claufe in it that impowered the I ruftees to apply all Sums they may receive under this Act, in difcharge of all the Debts of those Bankers, in fuch Order and Courfe as those Truttees shall judge most for the Benefit of the Creditors. He observed that this Claufe was unjust, and in direct Opposition to the Bankruptcy Laws, both of England and Ireland, which direct that the Creditors shall be paid rateably in proportion to their respective Debts,

The Attorney General faid the bill gave a remedy to any Creditor who should think himtelf aggrieved, by an application to the Court of Chancery, which might give him redrefs in a lumnuary way.

Sir Francis Hutchinfon replied, that it was unreasonable to expole the Creditor to the expence and trouble of fuch an application.

The bill was then read paragraph by paragraph,

Mr. Molineux fpoke against the principle of the bill, as an ill precedent, and an improper interference of Parliament in a cafe which the laws for Bankers and Bankrupts had fufficiently provided regulations : He then moved, that the Chairman quit the Chair.

The bill was fupported by the Attorney General, Mr. D. Latouche, and Sir N. Lawlefs, as highly advantagens to the creditors.

Mr. Molineux withdrew his motion.

Monday, May 2.

The Houfe went into a committee on the bill for the encouragement of the filheries, reported, and ordered to fit again.

LIMERICK.

Extract of a letter from Cathel, dated April 30. -" We know not what a day may bring houfes, and cabbins, who enjoyed their property, and breakfailted in fecurity vellerday morning, are now lamenting over the afhes of their worldiy fubitance, without a place to lay their heads. About three o'Clock yesterday, a fire broke out in a Cabin on the Camas-road, where they were brewing, it quickly communicated to others. The people's diltraction at fuch a calamity in this town, is fuch, that there is no making them do any thing but fcreech. You may remember a row of high decent thatched houses fronting this fireet, as you come in from Golden. I faw the first of the fire and used my utmost endeavours to prevail on them, to apply wet blankets to the house that was next, but still untouched ;-but no one stirred. In ten minutes after, the whole range was on fire, and the drynels of the thatch, made it impollible to ftop the flames where they once reached. Luckily one Gentleman got blankets put on the Cabin at this fide, which probably prevented the whole town from being confumed. Had it happened at night, in all probability the greater part of the town would have been burnt to athes. The poor inhabitants are completely beggar'd. The foldiers behaved with the utmost humanity and activity. A collection is begun for the relief of the futterers, which I advifed to be carried on brickly, before people's feelings, which, on those occasions, are too apt to evaporate, and fublide."-

On Tuefday laft Mr. Joleph Carey, affifted by John Bloomfield, Elq; and the Diffillers of Newport, feized a private Still, Head and Worm, near the Mountains of Bilboa, which he lodged in his Majelty's Stores in this City.

Same day the Surprite, Capt, Alquoth, an East-India Packet, failed from this harbour for London.

This morning a female Infant was taken up drowned near the Old Quay, very much dishgured.

Died. This morning, fincerely lamented, Mrs. Kelly, relict of Mr. Michael Kelly, Merchant, whom the furvived but 11 days.
