Cork, Sept 1. By Captain Black, of the Mary, from Tortola, we are informed, that between two and three o'clock in the morning of Monday the 11th of July, there was a violent and tremendous, shock of an earthquake at Tortola, which continued near haif a minute. It was felt with more or left violence in all the adjacent Islands, but with little damage.
