Yesterday morning the body of a young man of the name of Kelly, was found murdered, (having received feveral stabs in the throat) in a field near the path way, from Island bridge to Chapelizod. He had been milling from Wednelday, on which day he was in Dublin about bufinels. He was by trade a ftone cutter of a most excellent character, and the chief

support of an aged mother.

Wednesday a gentleman, disordered in his fenfes, got out of a dining-room window in Chatham-street, and ran into Anne-street with Drake, London, butter. a case of loaded pistols, which he had by some means poffessed himself of previous to his efcape from the place of his abode. Providentially, though in the highest paroxysm of his diforder, and fo formidably equipped for mifchief, he contented himfelf with firing at a hall door, through which he drove a ball; aftor which, the violence of his difeafe having fublided, and being fatigued with his exertions during its continuance, he fat himfelf down, when fome persons appointed to attend him feized the opportunity of fecuring and reftoring him to the care of his friends.

A young man, who it is faid has fome genteel connexions, but who at any rate has for fome time past cut a firsthy figure in and about this metropolis, was yesterday committed to the New Prilon, on a charge of being one of the persons concerned in the robbery of Lord Sudley and Lady Anne Hatton, one night haft week in the Phenix Park. This young gentleman was remarkable for being one of the best

mounted equestrians in town.


