

...put eight on Monday evening last from Monck's-town, was attacked about a mile from Stephen's-green, on Donnybrook Road, by three men, who suddenly rushed from behind a hedge, and knocked him down, at the same time using the most horrid oaths, that they would be the death of him; but on his imploring them to save his life, they were content with completely houghing him in the right leg, in which situation they left him, and made off.—Being thus deprived of the use of that leg, he crawled along into town, when three gentlemen meeting him, had the humanity to conduct him to the Castle-guard, from whence he was taken in a sedan by the order of Colonel Frazer, Commanding Officer of the Barracks, to the Royal Infirmary.—Must this country be thus branded with the most inhuman barbarous practice that ever disgraced a civilized nation?

Yesterday morning the body of a young man of the name of Kelly, was found murdered, (having received several stabs in the throat) in a field near the path way, from Island bridge to Chapelizod. He had been missing from Wednesday, on which day he was in Dublin about business. He was by trade a stone-cutter of a most excellent character, and the chief support of an aged mother.

Wednesday a gentleman, disordered in his senses, got out of a dining-room window in Chatham-street, and ran into Anne-street with a case of loaded pistols, which he had by some means possessed himself of previous to his escape from the place of his abode. Providentially, though in the highest paroxysm of his disorder, and so formidably equipped for mischief, he contented himself with firing at a hall door, through which he drove a ball; after which, the violence of his disease having subsided, and being fatigued with his exertions during its continuance, he sat himself down, when some persons appointed to attend him seized the opportunity of securing and restoring him to the care of his friends.

A young man, who it is said has some genteel connexions, but who at any rate has for some time past cut a flashy figure in and about this metropolis, was yesterday committed to the New Prison, on a charge of being one of the persons concerned in the robbery of Lord Sudley and Lady Anne Hatton, one night last week in the Phoenix Park. This young gentleman was remarkable for being one of the best mounted equestrians in town.

The surgeons having made a favourable report of Mr. Crawley's state of health, the military Officers confined in the New Prison on a charge of having assaulted and desperately wounded him, were yesterday enlarged upon bail.
