 chiefs, 14 Aprons of Muslin, Cambrick, Lawn,
 and Cheque; 5 Silk, Poplin, and White Petticoats,
 3 Linen Gowns, 1 Muslin ditto, and Per-
 ticot, Pink and White Brocade ditto, a Pel-
 onese and Hat dress, 2 Gilt Hats, 1 Ditto Bonnet,
 2 long Crimson Cloaks, 2 long Black silk ditto,
