Assembly Quay, Oct. 20, 1785.

From the Kitchen they took a new Copper Tea Kettle, and Stand; 3 large Copper pot Lids, Copper Spoons, Copper Coffeepot, a hammered Brass Skillet, a Copper Warming Pan, 4 Pillar Candlesticks, a Brass-Bar ditto, Parlour Fire Irons, a Flesh-fork, Trailing fork, Skimmer, Iron Ladles, a Hand, &c. they then went to the Room they had selected the people, and made them open several Trunks and Boxes, from which they took 6 Table Cloths, 6 Plain Sheets, 3 Towels, 6 Pillow cases, some Plain and Ruined Shirts, 7 Pair of New and Old Silk Stockings, Silk and Cotton ditto, with Silk stockings; 4 pair Cotton ditto, 3 pair Women's Shoes and Slippers, 2 pair Silver and 1 pair of Gold Shoe buckles, a Garnet and Pearl Necklace, 3 Gold Pins, several Caps, 1 dozen Handkerchiefs, 14 Aprons of Muslin, Cambric, Lawn, and Chequer; 5 Silk, Poplin, and White Petticoats, 3 Linen Gowns, 1 Muslin ditto, and Petticoat, Pink and White Brocade ditto, a Polonaise and Hat-dress, 2 Silk Hats, 1 Ditto Bonnet, a long Crimson Cloak, 1 long Black silk ditto, a short Black, and 1 White silk, and 1 Cotton ditto, several pieces of stamped Linen and Cotton, and plain Linen, several pieces of Muslin, Lace, Edging, Ribbons, &c. 4 pair of single brass Branches, and 4 pair of Double Armed Branches, 2 for four candle, and 2 pair for two candle each; 1 pair of Chocolate broad cloth cloths, with Silver Filligree Buttons; 1 Brown Crab ditto, mohair bottom; 1 Mixed ditto, Japan Buttons; Trailing coat, a frize coat, 1 pair Velvet Indian ribbed; 1 Jean and other Waistcoats, 1 pair of black Silk, 1 cloth and 1 of leather breeches, 1 Hat, several pair of new and old Shoes, Boots, and Slippers; 1 new Gun, 1 Musket, a quantity of children's Frock, Coats and Rocke; a green cloth cover from a Table, 1 yard and half long and a yard wide, and several Books; they then returned to the Kitchen, set down, eat, and break 4 bottles of claret, &c. and continued there about two hours and a half, and took out about a dozen more Wine, which they carried with them, with a quantity of Whiskey, some of their Wine they drank on their return, and threw the empty bottles about the road, as they went; they broke open another Cellar and two Cupboards, but what was taken out of them is not yet ascertained.
