WHEREAS on Wednesday night the 19th of October, between the hours of 12 and 13 the house of WILLIAM LEESON, of Bolingbrook, Esq; in the Co. Tipperary, was broke open, and entered by three men, armed with Guns, Pistols, and Bayonets, with Lights in their hands, while 3 or 4 others with 3 horses paraded and guarded the outside, and with horrid Imprecation, went to the Steward's Room, and bound him and then drove him and three women that all lay in separate Rooms into one Apartment, the door of which was guarded by one of the men, who discharged a pistol and swore he'd blow out the brains of the first that looked or stirred; they then went to a Cellar and broke open the door, from which they took a box containing the following Articles, 10 Silver Spoons, 2 large ditto, 4 Desert ditto, 2 Children's ditto, Engraved M. L. and W. L. in Cyphers, 4 new Silver Salts, with three feet, and Shovels; 2 large Goblets Gilt inside, 2 Bottle Coasters, 4 Labels, 11 Tea Spoons, Spring Tea Tongs, Six new Spoons, and other things not recollected; the Goblets had arms engraved in a Shield, which is a Lee Sun rising behind a Bloody Cloud; some things had a Crest, a Demi Lyon Rampant, holding the Sun in his Paws, 1 Dizen green Hasted Knives and Forks, 2 Carving ditto, 4 white hasted Breakfast Knives, 1 Loaf of Sugar, and several other things. From the Dairy which they broke open, they took a large Crook of butter, they then broke open two Parlour doors, in one of which was a Desk, which they broke open, and carried off 18 large and 24 small Gold Buttons, a drawer with several sets of Club Buttons, a Gemstone set very large, with a Brush gilt in the center; a drawer with a quantity of broken Silver, and with it a bad shilling of Copper silvered and a hole through it; 2 pair of Rose Diamond Ear-Rings in two sapphire Cases, and the two in one Case lined with Purple Sattin and Silver; a pair of Gold Ear Rings, some Gold Rings, several Antique Seals, Medals and Coins of various sorts, 4 Metal Watches about a yard string together with Silver Wire of cut Crystal Swags; about six Cards of rich gilt Chain, a Dead of 5 Houses, Coach Houses, &c. &c. in the Parish of Ballyc and Co. Middlesex; a Lease of Houses in the Parish of St. James, Clerkenwell, London; a Deed of a House, Offices, and Land, at Hatch-End in the Co.
