other outrages, on him and his family.—
Some day, Thomas Cody, charged on oath,
with being one of the party who committed the
above outrage.

of what they deem the exactions of Tythe-
proctors, two troops of the 8th Light Dragoons

Ballyloughran, having a few days ago received
a threatening letter, has been since that time
under the necessity of keeping a guard of
armed men in his house, for the protection of
his family.
