Part of the Flour intended for this kind of Bread, being made into Dough, with warm Water, and a little Salt, is laid in the rest of the Flour, an hour, or more, in which time it rifes to three times the bulk; then they mix and knead the whole with more Water, till it is brought into a fliff Dough, which being formed into Luaves, is baked in the Oven: tho' the more usual way is to take a piece of the kneaded Dough, and leave it covered with Flour, till the next time, then break it fmall, and mix it with the Flour, adding fome Yeatt, warm Water and Salt, as above directed.
