The trial of Mr. Fitzgerald is certainly appointed for the 7th of next month, at Caftlebar, as the application for trial in Dublin could not be complied with for the following reasons: There are twenty-two persons to be tried for the murder of Mr. M'Donald and Mr. Hypfon, befides Pitzgerald, and each having, by law, the right of challenging a certain number of those impannelled as jurous, little less than the attendance of all the freeholders in the county of Mayo would be found necessary : a matter totolly impracticable.

Mr. Firzgerald's mother, we hear, has been for some time past at Turlough-house, and is very industrious in making every disposition that may tend to her lon's benefit,

It was reported through town yeste day, and the day before, that the noted Brecknock had died last week in Castlebar gaol, owing to his having refrained from taking fufficient fuffenance. Whether the report be lounded in fact, we know not, but it is pretty generally credited.

From the great number of witnesses to be examined on the trial of Mr. Fitzgerald, and the other persons charged with the murder of Mr. M'Donnel and Hiplon, it is probable that it will engage the court for feveral days. There is most certainly a very great impropriety in fuffering a jury to disperse after having been once impannelled, and hearing evidence on a cause, as was the case lately in the Court of Common Pleas, in the cause of Newburgh and Burrows, and it can only be justified by neceffity; an instance of a similar nature is not within our memory, except that of the Earl of Angletea, There should therefore, be some remedy devised, and although it is an absolute impossibility for any Beach or Jury to attend their duty on a taial for two or three days and nights fuccessively, yet furely fome provision might be made for keeping the jury together, and for preventing any person from having accels to them; no man who fets a true value on that inclimable privilege, the right off the people to a trial by jury, if impannelled, would deem fuch commement a hardthip.

Possibly it may be thought, that a jury would be above corruption-for the honour of buman nature we must think fo-and that this precaution would be unnecessary -Rut upon the fame principle we should neglect all precaution; it is most undoubtedly necessary to obviate every thing that may lend to temptation, and preclude every means that may give an opportunity for tampering with jurors, or open a door for feduction; for we all know-bumanum ell errare.

All the balloon apparatus belonging to Vincent Lunardi, Efq, has arrived in our bay, and is now on board the Flenor, along with a complete and very large balloon. It is reported, that Mr. Lunardi is on his way, to pay us a visit, in order to make an attempt at croffing the channel.
