Yefterday morning, at about two o'clock, the poft-boy conveying the mail of letters for the Wicklow road, was ftopped near Leefonffreet, by a fingle armed footpad, who opened the post bags for the towns of Bray, Gorey, and Wexford, from each of which he took feveral letters, fome of which he tore.

Friday laft, a Galway, or Oranmore veficl, filhing off the island called Blafques, on the Weft coaft, ritted two Sun fift, of a monitrous fize, which they effected with great difficulty, They returned immediately to harbour with their prizes, one of which they cut up, and flowed, the other they dragged after the boat. It is imagined thele fifh, if properly managed, will yield above two tons of oil, worth, at leaft forty or fifty pounds.

The fate of the late unfortunate Fitzgerald was carefully concealed from his daughter, who relided in Dublin; and her father's misfortunes would not have been known to her, but from the following circumstance: She was fitting at a window facing the ftreet, and heard a man calling out, " The laft dying speech of George Robert Fitzgerald."- At first she difregarded it, but on hearing a repitition, with the addition of "- late of the county of Mayo," it was evident it could be no other perfon than her father; the immediately dropt out of her chair in a fit, and was with great difficulty recovered. She has remained in a very dangerous flate ever fince.

Cork, July 13. We hear that on Friday morning, the Magiftrates in the neighbourhood of the Pariflues of Liffee and Timoleague, affifted by the gentlemen of faid Parithes and their vicinity, met and fearched all fulpected houfe within fome miles round, and feized a number of fire-arms, particularly loaded mufquets, with feveral hangers, and other weapons constructed by the common fmiths of the country. It is hoped that if the gentlemen in their respective parishes would exert themselves in like manner, it would put an effectual flop to those meetings which difturb the peace of the country.

We are defired to infert the following account of a difcovery in agriculture, which is eftabliffied by actual experiments :- A farmer in this neighbourhood, finding his turnips for fome years palt taken by the fly, was induced to try experiments to prevent it : the following, luckily, proved a remedy-To 6b of turnip feed he put 4 oz of flour of brimilane, which he fowed together; the brimitone effectually deltroyed, or gave fuch distalle to the fly, as to prevent its usual ravages, and he has produced great crops. We are affured of this from the beft authority, the atteftation of the farmer; and we think it well worth the attention of every other farmer.
