Extract of a letter from London, June 14. " We are particularly happy on hearing it reported laft night, that an accommodation was likely to take place between a Great Perfonage and the Prince of Wales."


Wednefday the fecond of August next, is appointed by the Lord Bishop of Limerick, for his ordinary Vilitation for the Diocefe of Limerick.
