On their way Mr. Herbert received information, that fome principals of thole milguided people were then at the chapel of Fieries, a imall dillance off the road, and having furrounded it, he took Peter Daly, James Sawage, and Timothy Cafey, against whom, we hear politive informations are given,----Oc fearching Daly, a fword was found concealed under his coat, and in his pocket a lift of the names of many of these people, among whom was his own, stiling hinstelf Captain Right, Spein, Rotterdam, Butter. and that of Savage as one of his Serjeants .-They were all fately lodged, yefterday evening, In our gaol.
