As all the criminal profecutions as are at the fuit of the Crown, it very frequently refts with the law officers of Government, whether to indict for a capital offence, or for a milbehaviour only. Now if feveral of the White-boys already tried and convicted might have been capitally indicted, from the excelles and vinlences committed, furely the lenity of Government must be allowed, to have had them indicted for mildemeanors only, and confequently fubjected on conviction, to a much lefs punifhment than might otherwise have awaited, from feveral late outrages, the heinoulnels of their conduct.

The grant made by the King of Spain in his convention with our monarch, that has lately been ratified, of liberty for his Majefty's fubjects to cut down and purc hale mahogany on the Spanish main in America, must be very acceptable to the cabinet makers of these kingdoms as the Jamaica woods are nearly exhaufted, as well as those which lay near the fea shore on the coast of Honduras.

The outrages lately committed in Callelyons, and its neighbourhood, are shocking to humanity: About a week ago, a numerous body of armed men furrounded the houfe of the Rev. Mr. Brown, in Caftlelyons, fired feveral shots, and with horrid cries demanded that a poor labouring man (who had taken fhelter in Mr. Brown's houfe) fhould be given up to them. A few night's after, they feized the poor man, ftripped him ftark-naked, and inflicted the cruelleft punifhments on his body with horfewhips, and on his head with flicks, the whole way from Callelyons to Rathcormack, where they tied him to a flake in the Market-Houfe, with orders to four men to guard him 'till nine o'clock next day, which orders were punctually executed.

He faid, that he had heard it rumoured, that the infurgents had in view other matters, which must be destructive to the conflitution if fuccessful; he would not give credit for an infiant to fuch rumours; he was convinced the firength and energy of Government, as we'l as the loyalty and fpirit of the nation, was such as would cruth an idea of the kind inftantly on its appearance. Government had firength and energy, but it alfo poffeffed humanity, and his Lordship was happy that the measures of Government hitherto were guided by that principle ; he declared his confidence that the legiflature, upon proper application and a proper conduct in the people, would exert infelf in giving them relief from every real oppression or grievance, his Lordthip concluded a very able and animated mech, to which we are very far from being able to do that juffice we would with, or which it deferves, by recommending to the worthy mover of the amendment, to withdraw it, as the clergy were in fuch a fituation that they could not confidently unite in a petition of the nature and tendency of that now under dicuffion.

The motion for the amendment being withdrawn, and the original motion, and petition being agreed to unanimoully, a motion was made (we forget by whom) that the Knights of the Shire be requefted to prefent the fame to the Houle of Commons, immediately at their next meeting. This motion being alfo agreed to unanimoufly, Stephen Edward Rice, Efq; moved two refolutions, daclaratary of the abhorrence of the meeting, at any attempt, of any description of men, to alter the conflitution or the Laws of the Land, by open force or fecret combination; and of their determined refolution to use every endeavour to bring all fuch perfons to the most exemplary punishment; which being agreed to unanimoufly, the Earl of Glandore moved, that the thanks of the County be given to the Lord Vifcount Kenmare, for his spirited and fuccefsfui exertions, in quelling the outrages lately prevalent in this county, and particularly for bringing the principals therein to juffice ; and that the High Sheriff be requested to prefent a copy of the refolution to the Noble Vifcount, Lord Glandore's motion paffed alfo unanimoufly. His Lordship prefaced this motion with a very handfome culogium on the loyalty publick fpirit, and affection for his country, which

fo ftrongly appeared in every part of the noble Vifcount's conduct,-an eulogium, which we had pleafure in hearing every gentleman bear ample teftimony to.
