The freedom of the guild was also voted un- animously to the Right Hon. Alleyne Fitz- herbert, Esq; in a silver box.

Many reasons could be urged in apology for some of our merchants not having been punctual, according to their promises; but I must observe at the same time, that many articles of very damaged goods came pouring in upon us from Ireland, and in several cafes without any orders or commissions what- ever from this side of the water, which tended also to create prejudice among us.
