Extract of a letter from Killarney, Jan. 25.—“Early on Tuesday morning last this town was unexpectedly visited by Mr. Wm. B Swan, Inspector of Excise, who arrived at Ross Castle barrack, within a mile of this place, about three o'clock in the morning, after a journey of at least 40 miles, which he performed in about six hours. From the barrack he took a party of the 62d regt. quartered here, and having first placed sentinels on the houses of the most suspected persons, began a general search, and in a short time discovered not less than ten tobacco manufactories, seized several tons of leaf and stalk tobacco, together with the different utensils used in the manuf.
