Extract of a letter from Killarney, Jan. 25-
"Early on Tuesday morning last this town
was unexpectedly visited by Mr. Wm. B Swan,
Inspector of Excise, who arrived at Ross Castle
barrack, within a mile of this place, about
three o'clock in the morning, after a journey
of at least 40 miles, which he performed in
about six hours. From the barrack he took a
party of the 62d regt. quartered here, and
having first placed sentinels on the houses
of the most suspected persons, began a general
search, and in a short time discovered not less
than ten tobacco manufactories, seized several
tons of leaf and stalk tobacco, together with
the different utensils used in the manuf. During
the above commoody."
It is estimated that the losses of the Revenue,
