COUNTRY NEWS.

Cork, Jan. 31. Yesterday morning a most wanton and inhuman murder was committed near Ballinamona: The Chief and Sub-Constables of Barrymore, having a warrant against two men charged with different felonies, on being conducted to a house, where they had received information that one of them was, they knocked at the door, and desired admittance to search for such a person, (pleading this warrant and information,) the door was immediately opened by the party inside, when two of the Constables entered, one of whom was instantly knocked down with a pike, and the other, Mr. James Martin, received the whole contents of a gun in his face, and instantly expired. We are happy to hear, that the perpetrators of this horrid murder are apprehended.

And early this morning, Gibbs Ross, Esq; Ranger of the County, set out in search of the persons concerned in the above, and apprehended Jeremiah and Cornelius Garven, charged with the murder; and committed them to our county gaol, assisted by two constables of the District of Fermoy, and six of the 12th Light Dragoons.

On Wednesday last, the 30th of January, Died, at his seat at Stagdale-Lodge, Co. of Limerick, the Right Hon. Hugh, Lord Baron Maffey, in the 83d year of his age: His Lordship was descended from one of the ancient Barons of the County-Palatine of Chester, where his Ancestors were of chief eminence, and possessed several Lordships and Manors, having been Barons of Dunham-Massy there, for many generations after the Norman Conquest of England in 1066, and were descended from the Lords of Maffey in Normandy, where they flourished in great honour from the time of the Conquest of that part of France by Rollo, about 876.
