At Omagh af-

eleven and twelve o'clock, the Under-Sheriff of this county, attended with a large guard of the military, repaired to the South gaol, and demanded the following prisoners, for execution, viz. Patrick Clanchy and Owen Maguire, guilty of a burglary and robbery at the house of Mr. Campion, at Ballyhooly; John Sullivan, James Mahony, William Hendley, Thos. Neale, and Laurence White, a lad about 18 years old, jointly guilty of a burglary and robbery at the house of Timothy Dorgan at Ballygibbin; and Michael Reardon, for a burglary and robbery in the house of John Buckley, at Kilberryhurt, who were placed in two carts, attended by five Roman Catholic Clergymen, the melancholy procession moved slowly to Gallows-green, where after some time spent in prayer, the four eldest were tied to the fatal tree, and after them the four youngest, and all were launched into eternity, amidst the greatest concourse of people ever assembled on such an occasion.—Since the year 1739, so great a number has not been executed in one day, in this city or county.

Same day, Wm. Wigmore, Andrew Griffin, John Smith, and Michael Murphy, for cutting and destroying pigs, were whipped from South to North Gate, pursuant to their sentence.

Ennis, March 31. Last Saturday, Mr. C. P. Bolton, Surveyor of Excise, assisted by Mess. Maurice O'Connor, and A. C. Stretch, gaugers, and a Captain's guard of the 27th Regt. from Clare Castle, destroyed a number of private shebeen brewings in this town, and seized a quantity of Malt, which was lodged in the Custom-house stores.
