There are allo Lutherans and Calvinifts, and the fouthern parts, bordering on Perlia, many Jews relide. The Tartars, who have been converted to Christianity. Still retain their lucky and unlucky days. A blackhird flying acrols a toad; a crow or a cuckoo observed litting on the roof of a house, with many other events of a like nature, are supposed to prognosticate death, or the most dangerous diforders or accidents,
