Last Monday, John Downs, Esq; Inspector of Excise, assisted by Messrs. Hayes and Sergeant, Revenue Officers, detected an extensive private tobacco manufactory, in the suburbs of this city, wherein they seized a large quantity of leaf tobacco, with a tobacco table, wheel, cases, &c. besides a considerable quantity of tobacco in a state of manufacture; all of which were lodged in his Majesty's stores.
