are the tall of flocks, are ftrong indications that war is apprehended. Should it take place it will also materially affect our flocks; of this there can be no doubt, when it is remembered the 4 per cent debentures fold for 781. in the last war.

Alderman Carleton has got the contract for the live flock intended for Gibraltar garrifno; he has already purchased upwards of 1000 oxen.

AQUATIC EXCURSION. This mark of attention of the Viceroy to the Grand Canal Company, does him much honour, and what he has now leen of their works, must strongly incline him to favour their laudable and spirited undertaking. Little excursions into the country, whether by land or water, enable a Chief Governor better than ten thousand reports to judge of its state, and of what may be wanting for its relief or improvement.
